Guidelines for the publication of publication based or oriented doctoral theses and theses in which collaboration has taken place

- The publication of your doctoral thesis in a publication based or oriented form on the basis of articles in one or more journals is possible <u>without</u> uploading the articles to the University Library online server if you submit 5 copies <u>and</u>:
 - all the articles have been published
 - you have included an overview page with the copies which provides information on the publications in the journals
 - the Dean's Office provides a relevant cover letter to go with the copies sent to the University Library
- 2. If as yet not all parts of a publication based or oriented doctoral thesis have been published and some parts are, for instance, still in the review process (or are to be published later or not at all), or if publication of all the articles in journals is not expected in the required time, the doctoral thesis may be made available via the online server if you ensure that there is no infringement of the patents and licensing rights of the journals in which the material is to be published.

In exceptional cases and with binding, written confirmation of the moment of clearance for reprints by the publishing company or companies which have already published the material, publication on the publication server may also be held back until the copyright period has expired, however only for a maximum of two years starting from the date of the oral examination.

- 3. When doctoral theses containing submitted papers or conference papers are published on the University Library publication server, the author must be aware that publication on the University Library server makes later publication in a journal more difficult. However, the preliminary version and the final version are usually sufficiently different from one another. Once uploaded, a doctoral thesis cannot be removed from the publication server.
- 4. Be aware of the <u>copyright of Coauthors</u> if you have for example worked on papers included in the thesis together with other scientists and make sure to get their consent before printing. The doctoral candidate has to take care himself no copyrights are infringed.
