"Readings of the Border" Discourses of Division and Unification in Contemporary Literatures

Universität Tübingen, Germany November 6-9, 2019

It is a pleasure to invite you to the Winter School "Readings of the Border," organized by the Department of Korean Studies and the Department of German Studies at the University of Tübingen.

This Winter School will take place in the days leading up to the historic date of the 30th anniversary of the fall of the Berlin Wall on November 9, 2019. In the same way the Berlin Wall has been the global symbol for Cold War ideological division, the fall of the Wall has become equally over-determined in its representation of the end of the Cold War era with all its immediate implications, such as momentary conjectures of freedom, a borderless world or the victory of capitalism. However, we have seen the rise of nationalism, the multiplication of borders and walls since the collapse of the old Cold War world order. The renaissance of border studies in the last decades bears witness to this development, suggesting that the topic may even be timelier in the post-Wall era.

In multiple workshops, held by experts in the fields of literature, film and border studies from Europe, Asia and the USA, this interdisciplinary Winter School will explore what lies beyond the Berlin Wall. Looking to inspire a dialogue between German literature and the multiple sites of former Cold War division, we have a special focus on the Korean Peninsula and are open to research on further areas and literatures.

Topics of interest include, but are not limited to:

- Literatures of Divided Nations
- Border Spaces and Mediality
- Borders and History Writing
- Border Spaces as Expression of Belonging or Exclusion
- Colonial Legacies and Diasporic Futures of Cold War Borders
- Cold War Borders and Cultural Geography
- National Division, Unification, Identity and Trauma
- Perceptions of the Other
- Censorship and Self-Censorship
- Borders and their Effect on Institutions
- Overcoming Borders by Interdisciplinary Academic Cooperation

Guidelines for Applicants

We are inviting **Ph.D. Candidates, Ph.D. Students and Master Students** from various fields to apply to the Winter School. While all workshops and presentations will be held in English, some reading knowledge of German is desirable for primary literature and the
