PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Domestic and overseas Korean Studies have witnessed both quantitative and qualitative developments with the increased number of researchers and scholars throughout the world. Young researchers in Korean Studies are, however, having difficulties finding programs in which they can learn about cutting-edge academic trends and enhance their own research expertise. They are also seeking ways to engage in mutual communication and share their ideas and research outcomes.
