

2012, 2013, 2015 Longitudinal Study:

- t3 confirmands
- tl beginning of confirmation time
- t2 end of confirmation time
- t3 2 years after confirmation

2014-2016 Study:

- t0 phone interviews ministers 2013
- t0 focus group AME seminarians 2013
- tl confirmands, parents, leaders (fall 2014 spring 2015 & fall 2015 spring 2016)
- t2 confirmands (summer 2015 & summer 2016)

** 25% of t1 youth took t2

Important Contextual Differences

- * "there is a clear lacuna concerning youth and religion in Europe" (Schweitzer, 2015, 17)
 - * Youth and Religion is getting significant attention and \$\$\$ in the US
- * "confirmation is the largest educational program of most Protestant Churches in Europe" (Schweitzer, 2015, 17)
 - * Confirmation fits within a larger ecology of faith formation in the US
- * Their "far reaching aim" is "to improve the practice of confirmation work." (Schweitzer, 2015, 18)
 - * The aim of confirmation in the US is connected making disciples of Jesus Christ, however, there is a lack of agreement as to what this entails even within a congregation


General US Findings

- * Confirmands "Like" church




How do youth participating in confirmation compare with American youth generally?


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Attitude toward Christian Faith and Church

• Average Likert scores are given on a scale of 1 (very negative) to 5 (very positive).




Belonging

Beliefs

Not Religious Rebels

Youth report that their faith is more similar to their parents than their own congregation or denomination

Mostly the "Regulars"

Parents who have taken their kids to past church events (Sunday worship, Sunday school, youth ministry) are now signing their kids up for confirmation

Participation is a Personal Choice

YET, youth believe they are internally motivated

Is confirmation supposed to be for "insiders" only, or is this a moment for evangelism?


Is confirmation a time to "afflict the comfortable"? Or Raise hard questions?

Numbers indicate the percentages of respondents who selected the particular answers




Congregational Participation

- Nearly 85% of confirmands participate in worship services monthly
- How are confirmands acknowledged, leading, or included in worship?
- Over 80% attend a wedding, baptism, or funeral every year.
- Are these "life events" included in the content of what is covered in confirmation?

Questions 18-19 (ALL YOUTH): How often do you read the Bible AND How often do you pray?



Behaviors and Practices

Biblical Reading

Almost 45% of youth reported reading the Bible at least once a month by themselves.

The age of 12 or 13 seems to be when youth experience their first "overnight away from home" experiences.















Comparison on Volunteering

US:

"I can imagine myself volunteering in church during confirmation this year" 78% (t1) and 90% (t2) somewhat or strongly agree

"I can imagine myself volunteering <u>outside</u> of church during confirmation this year" 81% (t1) and 90% (t2) somewhat or strongly agree

European:


"I can imagine working as a volunteer in the church during confirmation time" 16% (t1) and 30% (t2) somewhat or strongly agree







Chart 4C: Level of Agreement with Faith Statements (Confirmation Project Charts and Graphics.docx, 2017)




Comparison of Youth Responses to Questions About Beliefs

American youth participating in confirmation and equivalent practices self-report higher levels (almost double in some categories) of belief than European youth

"God loves all humans and cares about each one of us"


- Europe 2007: 59% (t2, 64%) answered 5, 6, or 7, based on a 7 point scale
- Europe 2012: 62% (t2 64%) answered 5, 6, or 7, based on a 7 point scale
- US 2014/15: 94% (t2 94%) answered 4 or 5 based on a 5 point scale



Comparison of Youth Responses to Questions About Beliefs


"God created the world"

- Europe 2007: 42% (t2, 41%) answered 5, 6, or 7, based on a 7 point scale
- Europe 2012: 38% (t2, 41%) answered 5, 6, or 7, based on a 7 point scale
- US 2014/15: 88% (t2, 87%) answered 4 or 5 based on a 5 point scale




"There is [resurrection] life after death"

- Europe 2007: 50% (t2, 55%) answered 5, 6, or 7, based on a 7 point scale
- Europe 2012: 51% (t2, 55%) answered 5, 6, or 7, based on a 7 point scale
- US 2014/15: 82% (t2, 84%) answered 4 or 5 based on a 5 point scale




"Jesus has [is] risen from the dead"

- Europe 2007: 45% (t2, 48%) answered 5, 6, or 7, based on a 7 point scale
- Europe 2012: 44% (t2, 48%) answered 5, 6, or 7, based on a 7 point scale
- US 2014/15: 89% (t2, 89%) answered 4 or 5 based on a 5 point scale



"I believe in God"

- Europe 2007: 57% (t2, 61%) answered 5, 6, or 7, based on a 7 point scale
- Europe 2012: 58% (t2, 60%) answered 5, 6, or 7, based on a 7 point scale
- US 2014/15: 93% answered 4 or 5 based on a 5 point scale







- Europe 2012: 35% (t2, 36%) answered 5, 6, or 7, based on a 7 point scale
- US 2014/15: 29% answered 4 or 5 based on a 5 point scale




"Faith in God helps me in difficult situations"

- Europe 2007: 29% (t2, 34%) answered 5, 6, or 7, based on a 7 point scale
- Europe 2012: 37% (t2, 44%) answered 5, 6, or 7, based on a 7 point scale
- US 2014/15: 81% answered 4 or 5 based on a 5 point scale



"I know what the Christian faith entails" European "I know [what it means to be a Christian]" US

- Europe 2007: 49% (t2, 67%) answered 5, 6, or 7, based on a 7 point scale
- Europe 2012: 49% (t2, 63%) answered 5, 6, or 7, based on a 7 point scale
- US 2014/15: 77% answered 4 or 5 based on a 5 point scale





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
