UMC Congregations that took part in the study (fall 2015-spring 2016)	700
Conferences that took part in the study (adult and youth)	56
Confirmands	416 from 40 conferences

The Confirmation Project Sample

Youth (Confirmands) Survey (416 respondents)

- > 40 conferences from 35 states
- Strong age distribution: median age is 13
- Racial representation reflects the denomination as a whole, with 16% minority respondents
- ➢ 62% female/38% male








Expectations: goals & motivation




Confirmands' attitudes toward Christian beliefs




