HOW TO Compile a Portfolio M.A. Cultures of the Global South / Culturas del Sud Global / Cultures du Sud global

A portfolio is an ungraded achievement proving your engagement with theoretical texts. It is designed to improve students' writing competence, ability to reflect on theoretical positions and continuing professionalization.

The portfolio documents the reading of theoretical texts and discusses them critically. Your area of research may be chosen to lead into research for your master's thesis or another project of study. The texts must be self-chosen and researched, but you need to discuss them with your lecturer in advance. It makes sense to choose texts which allow you to explore a connected subject or area of research.

The length of the portfolio is based on the number of credits to be achieved, that is a workload of 90 hours (1 credit equals 30 hours). This is comparable to the length of a term paper (3 credits).

On agreement, this means around 200 pages of text to read and comment on – around ten to twelve articles or book chapters. 90 hours divided by 10 will leave you around 9 hours to comment on each text. Participation in seminar sessions should not be counted in this context, as they are already accounted for in the module itself.

It is possible to include media practical contents. The additional expenditure is included in the crediting proposal.
