What Can We Learn from Ŭigwe about Late Chosŏn Dynasty State-run Construction Projects?

Abstract: The importance of construction for the Chosŏn state is not only visible to us in its material legacy, for example palaces, fortresses or city gates that are still extant or restored. It also becomes clear in the administrative and bureaucratic structures and practices as well as the underlying knowledge that we only began to understand in recent years. However, thorough documentation of these construction works or state-issued manuals comparable to Chinese models seemed to be missing within the official writings. The re-discovery of the genre of Ŭigwe led to new insights in diverse research fields including construction projects and architectural knowledge. With regard to construction projects, they appear to be the only official source we have today. Although labelled "manuals of state events" they inherit a much more profound meaning in the context of state legitimacy together with their function as archives of knowledge. By focussing on these Ŭigwe I examine the structures and processes of state-run construction projects. A general overview together with a pointed analysis of a selection of representative examples will provide insights not only within the context of architecture but also in a wider context of the socio-political system of the late Chosŏn dynasty.
