The Past as a Resource?

The value of the material past in and for the present is the topic that the SFB 1070 RESOURCECULTURES will discuss with **Professor Dan Hicks**, Professor of Contemporary Archaeology at the University of Oxford, in a **RESOURCECULTURES Dialogue** (Lecture + Discussion Round).

The lecture will consult some of the works of his upcoming exhibition on forced migration ("LANDE: the Calais 'Jungle' and Beyond") and from other fields of contemporary archaeology. Precarity and transience will be considered elements of domination to analyse how archaeologists can understand the past and the presence not only as temporal markers, but as resources for human life.

About: Dan Hicks (MA Oxon, PhD Bristol) is an anthropological archaeologist interested in material culture, heritage, museum collections, landscape archaeology and the connections between archaeology and anthropology in relation to material things. He is also a curator of the Pitt Rivers Museum, Oxford.
