Doshisha University established its first overseas campus, “Doshisha EU Campus at Tübingen University” (in short, “Doshisha EU Campus”) within the main campus of the University of Tübingen in Germany in 2017, thanks to the generous support and strong commitment of President Bernd Engler of the University of Tübingen. Doshisha EU Campus was established for the purpose of promoting research and educational exchanges with the University of Tübingen, as well as with other prestigious and excellent universities and research institutions in Germany and in other EU countries.

Doshisha University and the University of Tübingen have long and fruitful experiences in research and educational exchange, mainly in the fields of the humanities and social sciences. In 2019, we started the “Doshisha Week” at the University of Tübingen aiming at broadening the research exchange between Doshisha and Tübingen beside the humanities and social sciences to other disciplines, especially to the natural and life sciences. Doshisha COVID-19 Research Project

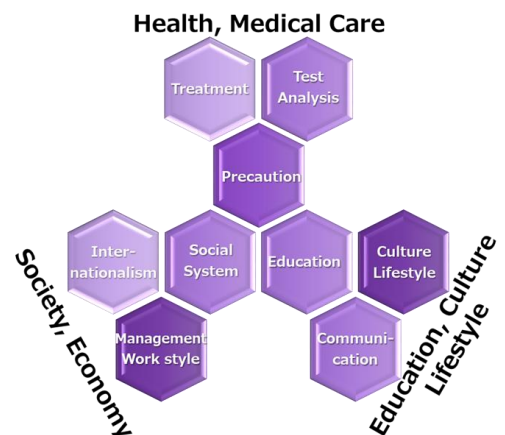
Doshisha University has launched the "COVID-19 Research Project" with 77 subjects of 9 fields covering 3 areas including "Health & Medical Care", "Society & Economy", and "Education, Culture & Lifestyle".

At present, the whole world is under the pandemic of COVID-19 which is said to occur once in a hundred years. It is also said that, after the pandemic is calmed down, new era of drastic changes, including changes in social structure and values, will come. However, even in these changes, responsibility of a university in education, research and social contribution does not change.
