Terms of use

Rules for the use of the family room at the University of Tübingen in Mohlstr. 36, room 323

It is an important concern of the University of Tübingen to be able to reconcile work/studies and family life. For this reason, the University will provide a family room for students and employees with children and pregnant women in Mohlstr. 36, room 323, from the winter semester 2023/24 onwards as a part of the family-friendly organization of the University.

For the use of the family room, users agree to the following rules of use:

1. Group of users

The family room is exclusively available to members of the University of Tübingen with children and pregnant women.

2. Purpose of use

The family room is intended to enable members of the University to bring their child/children to Mohlstr. 36 and supervise them themselves if care by third parties is unavailable at short notice or unexpectedly (e.g., sudden illness of the actual caregiver, kindergarten closed at short notice, cancellation of school lessons, etc.).

3. Rules of use

The use of the family room is generally free of charge. The family room can be used by several people at the same time. The maximum occupancy is two adults and two children. There is no general entitlement to use the room or to gain access to its key.

When entering the family room, please remove your shoes to avoid soiling. Shoes can be placed on the dirt mat by the floor.

Users of the family room are responsible for treating the furnishings and equipment of the room with care. No objects may be removed from the room. The family room must be left in a neat, clean and tidy condition.

Changing diapers is permitted in the family room.

Any particular soiling or garbage caused during the use of the family room must be removed by the users immediately after use.

Items that are subject to special hygiene requirements (e.g., stuffed toys, waterproof carpet pads) must be brought by the users of the room themselves and taken home again after using the family room. Toys, books or similar items that have been brought to the room must not be left behind.

4. Prohibited use

The care of children with notifiable diseases (such as chickenpox, mumps, measles, scarlet fever, rubella or lice) in the family room is prohibited. This also applies to severe febrile illnesses and infectious gastrointestinal diseases.

5. Occupancy and access

The family room can be used by authorized users after a one-time registration at <u>gleichstellung@wiso.uni-tuebingen.de</u>. Access options will be communicated upon registration.

6. Liability and duty of supervision

The family room provided is a study and office room and not a childcare facility. Neither the room nor the rest of the building meet the increased structural and safety requirements for daycare facilities. The

special standards that apply there cannot be applied to the family room. By using the room, the parents acknowledge this.

The University of Tübingen accepts no liability for items provided (e.g., toys). Likewise, the University of Tübingen accepts no responsibility for the loss of items brought into the room.

The use of the family room is at your own risk. The University of Tübingen is only liable for damages in the event of intent or gross negligence on the part of the University.

Culpable breaches of the duty of supervision (see above) by users of the family room may give rise to claims for damages. The University of Tübingen reserves the right to assert claims for any damage resulting from non-compliance with the duty of supervision.

In the event of anomalies or damages to the inventory, please contact <u>gleichstellung@wiso.uni-</u><u>tuebingen.de</u> or the janitor of Mohlstr. 36 immediately.

The users of the family room are responsible for supervising the children in this room.

Increased supervision requirements apply outside the room, particularly in corridors and sanitary facilities. Children must not be left unattended in the family room or anywhere in the building.

The University does not provide accident insurance cover for the children.

7. Data protection

A computer owned by the university must not be left for children to play with.

8. Exclusion from use

If students or employees violate these rules of use several times, they may be excluded from using the family room.

9. Exclusion of legal entitlement

There is neither a legal entitlement to use the family room nor to any particular furnishing of the room.

10. Declaration of consent

Parents or legal guardians who wish to use the family room have automatically given their consent to the above rules of use of the family room when using the room. A copy of these rules is posted the family room.
