How many years have you been working at the Language Learning Centre?

> Let me think...for 14 years, since May, 2002, a year after the founding of the Language Learning Centre.

There were few courses then, almost everything was done manually as we didn't have a booking system. The students came to register personally and stood in queues. With our boss, there were just two of us. The C-tests were evaluated on paper. There were course fees in those days and then the billing had to be done.

Do you have any anecdotes from that time?

Yes, it was the day of the listening comprehension for a UNIcert® III exam in Italian. Then, we had the audio documents on a cassette. Suddenly, in the middle of the exam, the tape tore. Oh dear! My boss and I quickly repaired it with sticky tape and a screwdriver! It felt as if I was in an operating theatre but it worked and the exam continued!

How were the students then, compared with today?

Actually, they haven't changed. Maybe they were a bit more independent in those days.

What do you like about your job?

I enjoy the contact with the students and I like working with different languages.

What is your favourite expression?

Nothing is forever.

It's the **uni**versity-specific modern languages **cert**ification system. It's based on a document agreed by leading German universities. Almost all FSZ courses in all 8 languages are UNIcert® accredited courses.

What are the advantages?

- You can do it alongside your studies!
- The certificate has no expiry date!
- It's free at the FSZ!

Why do I need it?

- To stand out on the job market the certificate is an excellent way to get your foot in the door whether it's for a job or an internship.
- To prepare you for a semester abroad –
 both linguistically and culturally.
- To gain entry to MA programmes the certificate states your language level and the skills acquired in 3-4 languages.
- To ease mobility acceptance throughout
 Germany & comparability throughout Europe.


