Facing the global challenges of environment and development, the United Nation's report "Our Common Future" (1987) has set the political agenda for Sustainable Development (SD), recently represented by the 2015 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG). The philosophical basis for such normative approaches has been set up and reflected by Environmental Ethics (EnvEth) since the 1970s. Facing moral pluralism, cultural specificities and postcolonial perspectives, the universalist and global dimension of both Sustainable Development and Environmental Ethics have been challenged and, in some instances, productively revised.

In this interactive workshop, we would like to gain some insights on the way, how Environmental Ethics and Sustainable Development are being discussed in Africa and Europe by proving some exemplary perspectives.
