Oregon (OUS Oregon University System) / Baden-Württemberg (BW) Cooperation and Exchange in Higher Education

History

Forty-two years ago, the vision of Professor Fritz Leonhardt, then Rector of the University of Stuttgart, and Professor Gordon Gilkey, Dean of the College of Liberal Arts at Oregon State University, gave rise to one of the most vibrant and successful academic exchange programs in Europe and the United States. The initial bilateral relationship between the University of Stuttgart and Oregon State University grew into a State-to-State exchange program that involves more than 20 institutions of higher education and that has facilitated the movement of more than 1200 students and many faculty and administrators.

The reciprocal nature of the program has been its strong point from the beginning. Oregon institutions provide tuition waiver to BW students and each exchange student from Oregon can expect a stipend provided by the Ministry of Science, Research and the Arts.

The Oregon Study Center (OSCG) was established to coordinate the exchange program in Baden-Württemberg and provides support to Oregon and BW students. It was located and hosted at Stuttgart University until 2002 and was then moved to Eberhard-Karls-University Tübingen where it is currently located.

In 1976, Jack Van de Water came to Oregon State University as Dean of International Programs and OUS Assistant Vice Chancellor. He spent more than a quarter century leading international initiatives for Oregon State and the Oregon University System. In cooperation with the Ministry of Science, Research and the Arts of the State of Baden-Württemberg, and working closely with the university partners on both sides, he and his colleagues endeavoured to make the Oregon Baden-Württemberg the exemplary program it is today. The results of this German-American partnership can be seen encompassed in the success and growth of the program.

In 2002, the OUS – Baden-Württemberg Exchange Program was awarded the Cooperation Prize from the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD). The program was honored as a "flagship of state to state cooperation."

Structure of the Exchange Program

In the 42 years since its inception, the Oregon / BW exchange program has opened the doors to over 1,200 students from each consortium to international study through a reciprocal exchange model that has been emulated by several other states and provinces.

Up to 40 students from each side - BW universities and partner universities in Oregon - can participate in the program. The original model of a year-long exchange program has given way to a more flexible semester model - giving study abroad opportunities to students whose curriculum or finances do not permit a full academic year away. Students are, however, strongly encouraged to participate for the full academic year.

For Oregon students the program requires two years of German (one year of German on an exception base) but it is not limited to German majors. Besides German language classes students may chose seminars and lectures in all academic fields.

BW students can apply as undergraduate or graduate non-degree seeking students at the partner universities in Oregon.

Seven public and two private universities in Oregon and nine public universities in Baden-Württemberg are members of the exchange consortia.

Faculty Exchange and Faculty Partnership Conference, October 2-7, 2010

Over the past 42 years the program has provided numerous opportunities for faculty from both consortia to collaborate, teach and conduct research at one of the partner institutions.

The intention of this reciprocal conference is to have faculty members from Baden-Württemberg universities familiarize themselves with the curriculum, learning, and research environments of their disciplines in the OUS universities. By "educating the educators," we hope that new opportunities for students will be seen both at the undergraduate and graduate levels.

In addition to providing on-going support for student activities, another major goal for this second faculty conference is to explore new opportunities for collaborative research and faculty connections and open doors for on-going faculty exchanges between the universities of Oregon and Baden-Württemberg.

OUS International Programs and the Ministry enthusiastically support the idea of this follow-up conference in Oregon.

The Faculty Partnership Conference 2008 between Oregon and Baden-Württemberg was sponsored by the Ministry of Science, Research and the Arts of the State of Baden-Württemberg and by BW universities and involves Oregon for the first time. Thirteen Oregon faculty members from several OUS and private universities were selected to participate in the conference.

The reciprocal **Faculty Partnership Conference 2010** in Oregon is jointly sponsored by the Ministry of Science, Research and the Arts of the State of Baden-Württemberg and by OUS International Programs. Seven Baden-Württemberg faculty members from several Baden-Württemberg universities were selected to visit partner institutions in Oregon.
