# THE LIGHT OF THE PROPHET IN THE ISLAMIC TRADITION

#### Introduction

We are pleased to announce the second edition of the Summer School "Studies in Sufism", organized by the association Perennia Verba (Parma, IT) in collaboration with the University of Palermo (IT), Scuola di Lingua italiana per Stranieri (IT), the Officina di Studi Medievali (Palermo, IT), the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia (IT), the Istituto per l'Oriente Carlo Alfonso Nallino (Rome, IT), and the Istituto di Scienze dell'Uomo (Rimini, IT), that this year will take place in Palermo on the Italian island of Sicily.



The aim of this second edition of the Summer School "Studies in Sufism" is to bring together a group of senior scholars, emerging researchers and postgraduate students working on Islamic thought, for a set of lectures, conversations and reading sessions on the theme of the Muhammadan Light (al-Nūr al-Muḥammadī) and the Muhammadan Reality (al-Ḥaqīqa al-Muḥammadiyya) in the history of Sufi thought and practices. Lessons will be in English, but as some of the sessions will consist in analyses of original texts, the ability to read classical Arabic is also desirable (it is not a prerequisite for admission to the Summer School though).

### Nūr Muḥammadī

The main topic of this year edition will be the study of the position and relevance of the concept of  $N\bar{u}r\ Muhammad\bar{\imath}$  within Islamic spirituality and literature. The school program will be organized around two main activities: one morning study session (approximately 2 hrs. plus 1 hr. discussion) and one afternoon lab dedicated to texts analysis. Each morning lesson will provide the students with the theoretical (historical and doctrinal) background they need to explore and discuss a specific aspect of the concept of  $N\bar{u}r\ Muhammad\bar{\imath}$ . In the afternoon students will work in groups and will have the opportunity to directly confront themselves with the primary Arabic sources that were at the core of each morning session. This will allow for an in-deep study of the various topics and for a more profound understanding of the textual and intellectual traditions that stemmed out from the notion of *Light of the Prophet Muhammad*.




The lessons will address earliest textual evidences of the concept of  $N\bar{u}r$   $Mu\dot{h}ammad\bar{\iota}$ , from the so-called " $\dot{h}ad\bar{\imath}t$   $\check{G}\bar{a}bir$ " to the Sufi commentaries that used this prophetic tradition as a basis for the development of a complex metaphysical doctrine and a large corpus of devotional texts and practices. The sources analysis will start with the  $Mu\dot{s}annaf$  of 'Abd al-Razzāq, and then move to the development of these traditions in  $dal\bar{a}'il$  and  $\dot{h}a\dot{s}\bar{a}'i\dot{s}$  al-nubuwwa (Ibn Dihya, 'Izz al-Dīn b. 'Abd al-Salām, al-Suyūtī, al-Qaṣtallanī). Metaphysical aspects of the  $N\bar{u}r$   $Mu\dot{h}ammad\bar{\iota}$  will be discussed on the basis of chapter 6 of Ibn 'Arabī's  $Fut\bar{u}\dot{h}\bar{a}t$  al-Makkiyya and other texts from exponents of the akbarian school, like Farġānī and al-Ğīlī.

As metaphysical developments stemming out from the notion of Light of the Prophet were not confined to the esoteric domain, lessons will also deal with devotional poetry (like the *Burda* and the *Hamziyya* of al-Būṣīrī) and prayer on the Prophet (as in the *Dalā'il al-ḥayrāt* of al-Ğazūlī and in al-Nabahānī's *Afḍal ṣalawāt 'alā al-Nabī*) that helped popularizing the ideas rooted in ḥadīt traditions and in their Sufi elaborations. This will show how all these trends did not grow separated from each other, but represent a single thread that runs throughout Islamic history.


Key lectures, by Paolo Urizzi (Perennia Verba), Demetrio Giordani (Università di Modena – Reggio Emilia), Ruggero Vimercati Sanseverino (University of Tübingen), Michele Petrone (University of Copenhagen), will be given in the morning. Lectures will address the key topics mentioned above from different academic and methodological perspectives (metaphysics, hadīt, devotional literature, spiritual practice).


During afternoon lab activities, coordinated and supervised by Andrea Brigaglia (Cape Town University, ZA), Michele Petrone (University of Copenhagen, DK), and Federico Salvaggio (University of Genoa, IT), texts, in the Arabic original and in English translation, will be analyzed from literary, historical and doctrinal points of view, and discussed against their social and theoretical context. Students' contribution to this part of the school will be essential as they will be guided by school collaborators to develop and express their personal understanding of the proposed passages and materials.

The working language of the Summer School will be English.



This year Summer School will take place, from the 23<sup>rd</sup> of August to the 2<sup>nd</sup> of September, in Palermo, in the Italian region of Sicily. Located in the heart of the Mediterranean, the city has always been a crossroads of peoples, cultures, languages, and religions. Capital of the Emirate of Sicily (9<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> centuries) and simply called *al-madīna* by its inhabitants, it counted over 300 mosques and numerous Sufi *ribats*. It was the home of a vibrant Islamic civilization whose influence can be still observed today in its architecture, urban design, agricultural and irrigation system, as well as in the local cuisine and language, and even in some of the cultural habits of its contemporary dwellers. UNESCO World Heritage Site since 2016, Palermo has been awarded with the title of Italian Capital of Culture of the year 2018 and this summer is getting ready for an exciting series of cultural activities and events taking place, day and night, in and around its palaces, museums, galleries, streets, and open-air markets.





#### Summer School Venue and Accommodation

All lectures and workshops will take place within the premises of the Scuola di Lingua Italiana per Stranieri, Piazza Sant'Antonino 1, 90134 Palermo. Set in the historic city centre, it will be the ideal starting point for after-school walking distance visits to most important Arab-Norman sites and many other tourist attractions. This year Palermo, as the Italian Capital of Culture, will host a series of conferences, happenings and artists from all over the world. Being close to the main train, bus, and underground stations (just 2 min. walking distance), from the school you will be able to easily reach any part of the city and you won't miss any of the amazing events taking place. From there, in 15 minutes, you will even be able to walk to the beautiful Foro Italico gardens for a relaxing lunch break on the seafront!

The course fee is of 350 euro and does NOT include travel and accommodation costs. The course fee is NON-REFUNDABLE, with the exception of specifically documented cases. The organization will provide information about partner hotels to the admitted students. There is also the possibility of an accommodation in a hosting structure of the University of Palermo. Prices and availability of places will be communicated to the admitted students. Those coming from U.S. or from African/Asian countries are asked to proceed to the visa request as soon as their admission to the school is confirmed. The organization is not responsible in any way for the administrative procedures regarding visas, but we will provide all possible help and information.

- 2. A CV, with level of knowledge of Classical Arabic and English. It may also include a list of selected publications (MA/PhD thesis, articles, books).

The deadline for the submission of the application is the 30<sup>th</sup> of June 2018. Applications will be processed as they are received up to the fulfillment of the available posts.
