#### "Promotion tour" at ERCCT Partner Institutions

Between 9-17 April, 2017, Prof. Gunter Schubert visited the College of Social Sciences at National Cheng Kung-University (Tainan), the Department of Sociology and the Institute of Political Science, National Sun Yat-Sen University (Kaohsiung), the Graduate Institute of International Politics, National Chung Hsing University (Taichung) and the College of Social Sciences at National Chengchi University (Taipei), all of which are ERCCT partners. In March, Prof. Gunter Schubert talked to students and faculty at the College of Social Sciences at National Taiwan University. He reported on recent developments at the ERCCT and introduced the center's different visiting programmes to students and faculty of the respective institutions. # CCKF-ERCCT staff fieldwork trip to China (Fujian) Pilot Free Trade Zone

Between 18 March and 8 April 2017, CCKF-ERCCT director Prof. Gunter Schubert and Fellow Sascha Zhivkov went on a joint fieldwork trip to investigate the China (Fujian) Pilot Free Trade Zone. Economic reform is at the heart of Xi Jinping's political agenda, with the Pilot Free Trade Zones being a core component of this process. However, while 11 Pilot Free Trade Zones now exist throughout China, western knowledge on the zones is still sparse and they remain hardly understood. With the Fujian Pilot Free Trade Zone specifically directed at attracting Taiwanese investment, it is an excellent destination for CCKF-ERCCT staff, linking up our research interests in Taiwanese entrepreneurs (Taishang), central and local government relations in China and China's search for a new economic model. Interviews with cadres and Taiwanese investors were conducted in Fuzhou, Pingtan and Xiamen. Research is generously supported by the German Research Foundation (DFG). The trip was only possible thanks to the incredible support and hospitality by Prof. Wang Liping, director of the Research Center of the China (Fujian) Pilot Free Trade Zone and his staff. A second trip is planned for the autumn of 2017.

## Our Visiting Scholars (Winter Term 2016/17)

In the past term, we had the pleasure to welcome a number of distinguished visiting scholars who engaged with our fellows and presented their ongoing research (<u>link</u> to the program).

Prof. Wang Hong-zen 王宏仁 from the Department of Sociology, National Sun Yat-sen University, Kaoshiung stayed at the center between 20 October and 15 November 2016. He held two talks: "Global production chains and labour control: Taiwanese capital in Vietnam" (3 November, 2016) and "Small signals from the alienated land: labour regimes in Taiwanese factories in Vietnam" (11 November 2016).

As a past Visiting Scholar, **Prof. Szabó Maté** from Eötvös Loránd University, Budapest, returned once again to the ERCCT and gave a public talk on 15 November, 2016, on the topic: "Can the Control Yuan develop into an Ombuds-Institution and a National Human Rights Institution for Taiwan?"
