¹ Due to the complex nature of working at the RWC and the sharp learning curve involved with the initial training period, candidates who can stay on for <u>two or more semesters</u> are preferred. Credit is awarded for the first semester in the RWC; tutors receive a paid Hiwi contract (20 hours/month) for all subsequent semesters of work.
