How did we end up here?











the imbroglios are apparently fading away, disentangled and solved in the disappearance of bodies from the screens

-> the adoption of the 2011 Commission Implementing Regulation allowing for the use of *security scanners* in EU airports

=> wider deployment of scanners for passengers' screening

the very possible closure of controversies triggers our research interest in this specific series of vanishing operations

The concept of the setting : a definition









A machine can no more be studied than a human, because what the analyst is faced with are assemblies of human and nonhuman actants where the competences and performances are distributed; the object of analysis is called a setting or a setup (in French a "dispositif") (Akrich and Latour, 1992:259)

Our stylistic ploy: bodies-scanners setting

- a loose notion of setting, which is structurally open to regard as actants all present material and immaterial elements, but also all apparently invisible and absent (spectral) elements

- [how to study a (security) dispositif?]

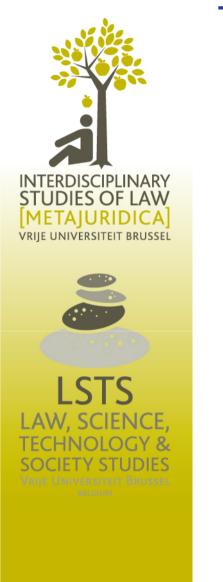

Politics of disappearance: the productiveness of voids which (de)stabilizes the setting

- Georges Perec and La disparition

- Jacques Derrida and the specter as the "visibility of the invisible"



Conclusions

- Dissonances in security practices can emerge: disappeared elements haunt the stabilization of the setting
- A continuous work of mustering of heterogeneous elements
- The closure of the political landscape is not predetermined, but actants have to be taken seriously (and involved in ≠ configurations)
