


# Figurations of the Precarious New Directions in Global South Studies International Research Symposium

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The conceptual field of the precarious has proven in the last years to be a central tool for analysing and making sense of our contemporary time. It extends nowadays well beyond the original economic focus on labour and wage relations. Images of the precarious circulate in cultural production and media; social and legal activism, institutional politics try to tackle widespread processes of precarisation and, last but not least, precarity constitutes a challenge to be dealt with and made sense of in everyday practices.

The semantic field of the precarious - comprising widely discussed theoretical concepts such as precarity. precariousness, precariat and precarisation - is gaining traction in Global South Studies for roughly a decade now. The challenge in this context is to overcome the prevailing Eurocentric set of norms in precarity studies that are not only related to the Fordist welfare State but also to notions of the liberal subject. The Symposiums aims at discussing subjectcentred research approaches in cooperation with our partners from the Global South. We suggest taking figurations of the precarious as a methodological tool. Figuration as the recognition of textual and social patterns of meaning by the subject refers first to thinking or acting in figures, i.e producing a work of imagination (to borrow a term coined by Arjun Appadurai 1996) with which people make sense of the world and times they live in and the ways they relate to it. It can also be easily related to Nobert Elias' figuration analysis (1965), which focusses understanding the dynamic networks of interaction, interdependence and entanglement that subjects necessarily evolve and act in.
