


## Live in the heart of it all



### Simply Tailor your Term.

We offer hundreds of courses across nine academic faculties. Most of these are open to Study Abroad and Exchange students.

How do you know what term is best for you? Work out how many credits you need to transfer back to your home institution, which term dates suit, and build your program from there.

### Standard Terms:

For those wanting 18 UNSW Credits (22.5 ECTS/3 courses)

### Tailored Terms:

For those wanting 24 UNSW Credits (30 ECTS/4 courses). Students take 1 course in either our Summer (January) or Winter (August) Term, and 3 courses in a standard Term.

### **Double Terms:**

For those wanting even more flexibility, you can choose 24 UNSW Credits (30 ECTS/4 courses) or add extra courses to boost this to 30 UNSW Credits (37.5 ECTS/5 courses). For the super studious, you can even do 36 UNSW Credits (45 ECTS/6 courses).

Double Terms can be like taking a Summer School and Semester away! Term 1 + Term 2 may align with your Spring Semesters plus Summer, while Term 2 + Term 3 your Summer plus Autumn Semester.

A cumulative grade point average of 2.7 on a 4.0 grading scale, ECTS C grade or equivalent standard from your home institution.

### **English requirements**

You may be asked to provide evidence of your English proficiency to study at UNSW depending on your educational background and citizenship.

### **Enrolment requirements**

- 18 UNSW Credits per Standard Term (22.5 ECTS/3 courses)
- 24 UNSW Credits per Tailored Term (30 ECTS/4 courses)
- 24~36 UNSW Credits per Double Term (30~45 ECTS/4~6 courses)
- 48 UNSW Credits per Year (60 ECTS/8 courses)

### 1. Create a profile

### 2. Start application

Ensure that the name on your application is the same as on your passport. Make sure that you choose all the Terms that you want to study at UNSW for.

### 3. Submit application

Prepare the following documents as a pdf to submit with your application:

- 1. Your most recent official academic transcript (with English translation)
- 2. The ID page of your passport
- 3. Proof of English language Proficiency if required

### 4. Choose courses

Choose courses that you wish to study while at UNSW and submit them for approval by UNSW. Check that the courses you wish to study are offered in the term you will be at UNSW and will be approved by your home institution.

### 5. Receive offer

If your application is successful, you will receive an offer letter by email.

### 6. Accept offer

Accept your offer online and pay your deposit and/or fees if applicable.

The following steps ( 7 to 9) are not applicable to virtual study abroad

### 7. Housing

Start to consider if you want to stay off campus, or apply for on-campus accommodation.

### 8. Receive CoE and Apply for Visa

You will receive a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) after you accept your offer. This is required for your visa application.

### 9. Book flights

Ensure that you will arrive in time for our orientation program.

OSHC is not required for virtual exchange

### **Application process**

### 1. Nomination

You need to be nominated by your home university, and they will choose one of our study plans for you. After being nominated, an email with application instructions will be sent to you.

### 2. Start application

Ensure that the name on your application is the same as on your passport.

### 3. Submit application

Prepare the following documents as a pdf to submit with your application:

- 1. Your most recent official academic transcript (with English translation)
- 2. The ID page of your passport
- 3. Proof of English language Proficiency if required

### 4. Choose courses

Choose courses that you wish to study while with UNSW and submit them for prerequisite approval by UNSW. Check that the courses you wish to study are offered in the term you will be at UNSW and will be approved by your home institution.

### 5. Receive offer

If your application is successful, you will receive an offer letter by email.

### 6. Accept offer

Accept your offer online.

### 7. Getting ready for your exchange

Further information on enrollment, getting ready and arrival details, if applicable, will be emailed to you in the lead up to the start of your exchange.

### **Entry Requirements**

A cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 grading scale – or equivalent standard from your home institution

You also need to find an academic at UNSW who agrees to supervise your research.

### **English requirements**

You will need to ensure you meet the UNSW English Language requirements and depending on your educational background and citizenship, you may be asked to provide evidence of your English proficiency to study at UNSW.

### **Tuition fees**

Tuition fees of AUD\$1,000 per term. One off admission fee of AUD\$330.

### Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)

Students are required to have OSHC for the duration of their student visa (except holders of Norwegian and Belgian passports). Details on how to purchase OSHC are provided on your acceptance.

OSHC is not required for virtual practicum

### **Application process**

### 1. Check you are eligible

You will need to ensure you meet the UNSW Entry and English Language requirements.

### 2. Find a supervisor

Contact UNSW academics to find a suitable supervisor and negotiate start and finish dates for your practicum.

### 3. Nomination

The academic then emails <u>practicum@unsw.edu.au</u> with your full name, email address, host UNSW school, stay dates and home university. Nominations must be received 3 months in advance of your proposed start date.

### 4. Application

The Study Abroad Research Practicum team will email you with details on how to fill in an online application.

### 5. Receive offer

If your application is successful, you will receive an acceptance letter by email.


### 6. Getting ready for your Practicum

# Find your new home



Feel at home with a range of award-winning accommodation on and off campus at UNSW. Live within walking distance of your lecture halls, meet people from around the world, and make lifelong friends.

### Accommodation at UNSW

Make friends from around the world and take comfort in the same extensive cleaning protocols that keep you safe on campus when you choose to live at UNSW. Save the commute, go home for lunch – there's so much to love about living at UNSW.

### Colleges

Live among students from all over the world including Aussies. Choose from full board, partially catered, and self-catered accommodation and options including male only, female only, and mixed male and female accommodation. Most colleges cater for dietary requirements like halal, kosher and vegetarian.

### **Apartments**

Apartments offer independent-style living for students from all walks of life. There are apartments on and off campus and costs vary depending on the number of rooms and the location. Details on how to apply will be sent to you after you've been accepted into a Study Abroad or Exchange program. There is one application portal for UNSW Colleges and Apartments, but separate processes for the affiliated and private providers.

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### Off Campus Living

If you are looking to live off campus, we have lots of information to help you make an informed decision. There is also information on how to arrange short term accommodation. For more information see

### Rental property

Choose from numerous private rental properties located in the surrounding suburbs of UNSW. You can rent a furnished or unfurnished property. Be sure to consider additional expenses such as electricity, gas, telephone and Wi-Fi. Costs vary but usually range from AUD\$250 – AUD\$350 per student per week in a shared house or apartment.

Sydney has several accommodation providers who specially cater to students. Accommodation is located around Sydney – generally around 20-50 minutes by public transport from the UNSW campus. These options offer high-quality rooms with air conditioning and extra services. Look for Iglu and Urbanest.

Find the home that's right for you. Take 360 virtual tours of rooms and compare prices at accommodation.unsw.edu.au.

### Temporary accommodation

We recommend having three to four weeks before classes begin to arrange private housing. Be sure to book short-term accommodation first, then look for long-term options in person. Short-term accommodation can include private hotels, motels, hostels, lodges or furnished apartments ranging from AUD\$45 – AUD\$300 per day.

### Under 18s

Arrangements must be made for students under 18 years of age according to Australian Government regulations for the welfare of international students under 18. For more information, visit student.unsw.edu.au/visa18
