I am aware that, as a matter of principle, pregnant and nursing women are prohibited from taking part in classes or assessment

- prior to 6:00 am
- after 8:00 pm
- on Sundays and public holidays
- 6 weeks prior to giving birth
- 8 weeks (or 12 weeks in special cases) after the birth.

In the case of university education, the pregnant woman may participate in classes between 8:00 pm and 10:00 pm and on Sundays and public holidays if this is necessary for educational purposes and does not result in unjustifiable solitary work. If there are no medical objections, she may also waive the protected maternity leave period before and after the birth.

I waive the following maternity protections (according to § 6 MuSchG) and am willing to study

- on Sundays and public holidays (e.g. for block seminars)
- between 8:00 and 10:00 pm (e.g. for excursions)

I waive the right to maternity leave (according to § 3 MuSchG)

- prior to giving birth (6 weeks)
- after the birth (usually 8 weeks)
