KrimDok is a comprehensive databank for international criminological literature. It is funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG) and contains one of the largest stocks of specialized literature worldwide regarding Criminology. Additionally, its goal is to continuously integrate more digital documents and open access offers. The entire stock as well as further criminological references can be researched via

KrimDok is operated by a cooperation between the University Library and the Criminological Department of the University of Tübingen. All offers are free of charge for users via university libraries and only the regular inter-library loan fees are incurred.

The aim of this project is to build a supra-regional literature and information service specifically for the needs and wants of the criminological scientific community. Recommendations for criminological publications (especially in English) are very welcome.

Our stock and acquisition profile

We acquire and collect literature on the following subject areas:

- Genesis of crime
- Forms of crime and types of perpetrators
- Prevention and combating crime
- Sanctions and treatment options
- Victims of crime

We mainly acquire criminological literature but also other literature which is relevant for criminological research. This includes fields like criminal justice, the penal system, criminalistics (including law enforcement research), psychology, psychiatry, sociology and pedagogy.



Easier literature and full text research via KrimDok

Using KrimDok is free of charge. It helps you find various **references** for criminological monographs, journals, essays and digital documents, and thereby facilitates your research process.



KrimDok offers a variety of open access full texts. This mainly includes so called "grey literature" (publications by ministries, NGOs, associations etc.).

The literature is mostly in German and English. However, other languages are covered as well. The German key words are successively translated into English and Spanish.
