

Applying for a Bachelor in Bioinformatics

as of October 2022

You can apply for a bachelor in bioinformatics if you have one of the qualifications listed below:

- German Abitur
- Foreign Abitur
- Another undergraduate Degree

You can check if your higher education entrance qualification allows you to apply for the bachelor in Germany at <http://anabin.kmk.org/anabin-datenbank.html>. The admission to the Bachelor in Bioinformatics is restricted. A good high school grade is highly recommended, and most importantly good math grades as well as good language skills in German and English. Most of the lectures will be held in German, though not all of them. If you do not have a German Abitur or another degree from a German university you will need to provide a certificate to prove your German proficiency. You either need

- Deutsche Sprachprüfung für den Hochschulzugang - at least DSH-2
- Test Deutsch als Fremdsprache (TestDaF) - at least level 4
- Prüfungsteil Deutsch der Feststellungsprüfung an Studienkollegs.

The application for the Bachelor of Bioinformatics takes place in the Dialog-Oriented Service Procedure (DoSV). Information can be found under

The deadline for application is January, 15 if you are applying for the summer term, and July, 15 if you are applying for the winter term both for residents outside of the EU and also for applicants from a European country. You will need a copy of all your certificates (i.e., school grades, diplomas, language skills...) which you will be asked to send in by regular mail. Note: Only send copies, no originals, because you will not get them back. Additionally you have to upload all certificates in pdf format during the online application process. Additionally you need to do a guidance assessment which you also need for your application. Such a test can be done at <http://www.was-studiere-ich.de/>.
