ERASMUS+ STAFF TRAINING WEEK  
Tübingen, 05 – 08 March 2018

### *Invitation*

Tübingen University has the pleasure to invite you to its first Erasmus+ Staff Training Week in the framework of the Erasmus+ Program which will take place from 05 to 08 March 2018.

The 4-day program includes presentations, round table discussions, and cultural/social events. The main aim is peer-learning, networking, transfer of knowledge and sharing of experience and practice among colleagues from partner institutions from EU countries.

International networking of scientists is becoming consistently more important – not only in the field of internationally monitored studies (OECD, Pisa) and methods like evidence-based research. But also researchers in the field of humanities, especially philosophy and pedagogy can join forces in order to strengthen their efforts.

The topics of your work field at your University are either

- **Teaching Philosophy** ('Fachdidaktik': subject matter didactics, learning objectives, methods – mostly classes for philosophy students) or
- **Philosophy of Education** ('Bildungsphilosophie': philosophical theories of education – mostly classes for teacher students of all subjects).

Our meeting and mutual exchange will foster the cooperation between philosophy and education.

The aim of the staff meeting is not just to catch up on topics that are currently being debated, but also to strengthen the bonds – politically, personally and philosophically – between colleagues from European partner universities who work in the same field: Philosophy – Education – School. It is for this reason that we would like to discuss the following questions:

- What is your area of work and what can be said about the significance of philosophical studies for your local teacher education agenda?
- What research projects (studies, articles) related to *Philosophy – Education – School* are you currently involved in?
- What example of teaching practice related to the topic can you present to the participants?
- Are there common European values involved in our work?



Tübingen also offers a wide variety of activities, ranging from the Hölderlin tower and Tübinger Stift to its winehouses and cultural institutions like the Jazzkeller.

The maximum number of participants will be 15 and the rule of 'first come, first served' will be applied.

There will be no participation fees. Participants can apply at their home institution for an Erasmus+ Staff Training Week Grant and will have to cover all costs related to this mobility. The coffee-breaks mentioned in the program will be offered by our Erasmus Mobility Team free of charge to all our guests.
