Gods and Kings The 2008-2010 Discoveries at Ebla

The three last excavation campaigns at Ebla concentrated on four main areas: minor operations, connected with the restoration project, in the area of the Royal Palace G of the Early Syrian period (ca. 2300 BC); more extended operations in Area HH, where a relevant cult building of the same age was brought to light (the Temple of the Rock); the acropolis, where the antecedents of the Middle Bronze I-II Temple D were identified, and where the area of the Middle Bronze I-II Royal Palace was sensibly enlarged; the region of private houses in Area B, south of the Acropolis.

The main results of these three campaigns will be synthetically presented, as well as the main results of the project “Ebla and its Landscape”, which are throwing light on the territory of the Chora of Ebla, and on the management of the local resources of the region.
