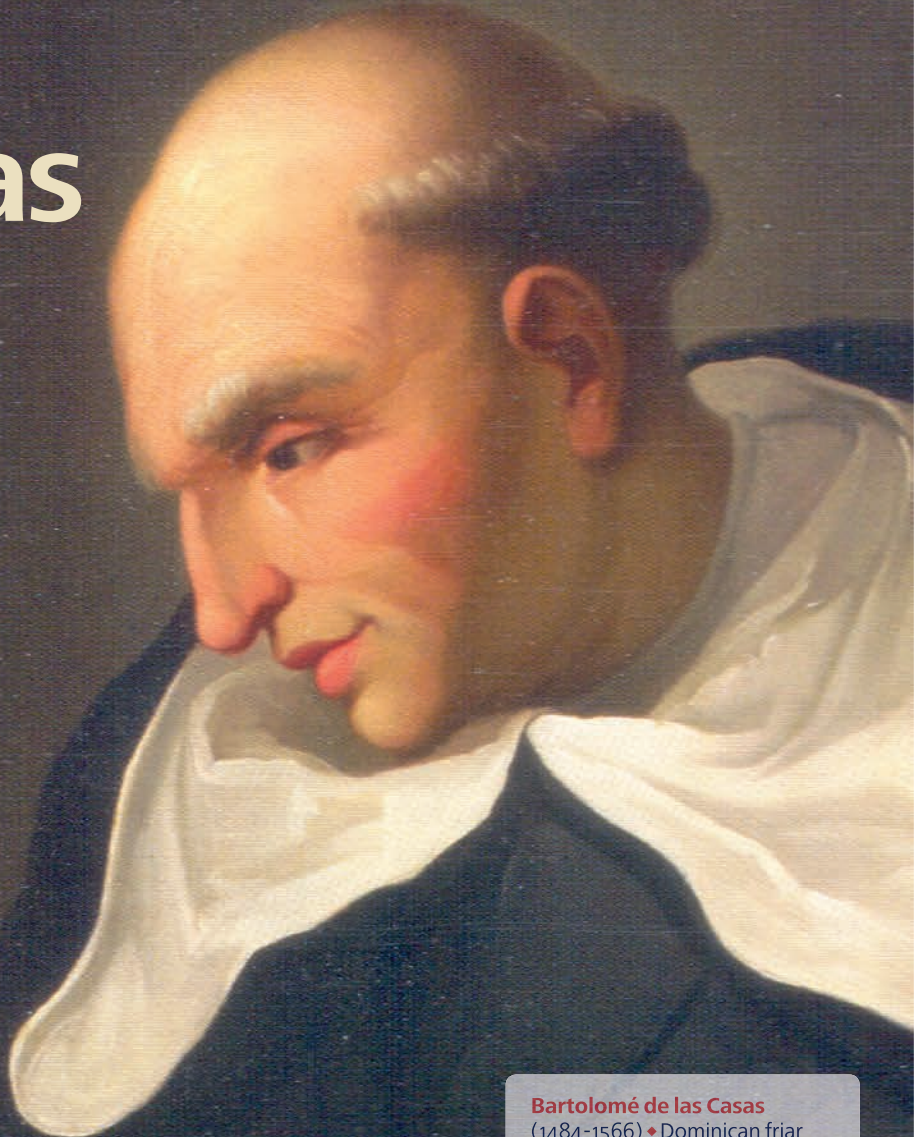




Bartolomé de Las Casas Prize 2017

- ♦ interreligious and intercultural
dialogue / theology of religions
- ♦ contextual (or intercultural or
comparative) theology
- ♦ history of the church and of the
theology of Asia, Africa and
Latin America
- ♦ Peace ethics in connection with
the questions of globalization

The dissertations may not be
more than two years old
(counted from the date of
this announcement).

assessments (these can be the
examination evaluations)

Bartolomé de las Casas

(1484-1566) ♦ Dominican friar
and bishop, called »an honour
for humankind« by the Chilean
Nobel Prize Winner for Litera-
ture, Gabriela Mistral, treated in
several treatises, exposés and
letters the social-ethical ques-
tions which arose as the result of
the first globalization in the
slipstream of European expan-
sion ♦ In these writings, in which
one notices Christian compas-
sion in the face of humanity's
story of suffering, he defended
peaceful evangelization, the
unity of the human family, the
rights of the Indian peoples, as
well as the dignity and logic of
their religions and cultures ♦
The »Institute for the Study of
Religions and for Interreligious
Dialogue« of the Theology
Faculty of the University of
Fribourg, Switzerland stands in
the tradition of this legacy.
