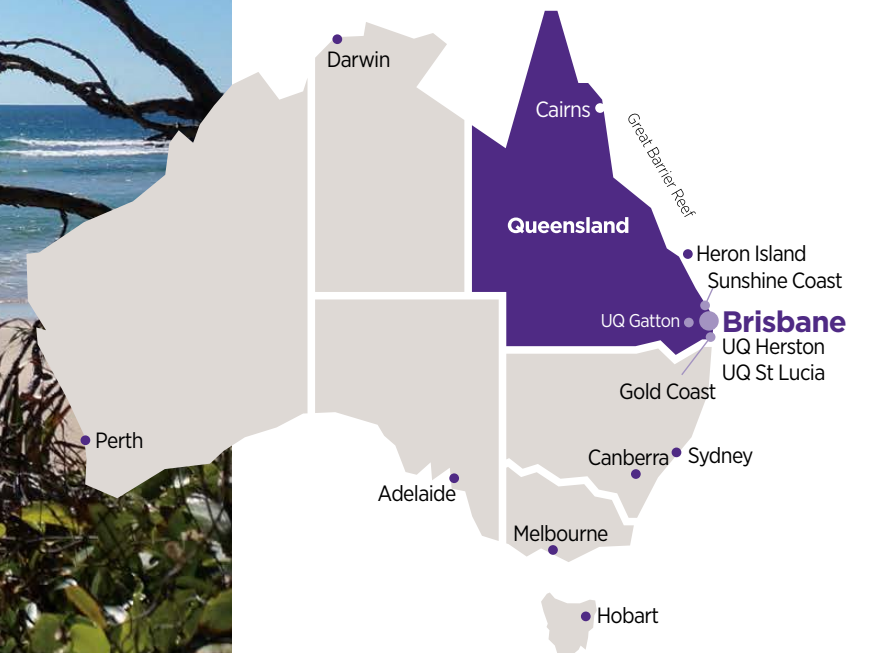

BRISBANE

Brisbane, the home of UQ's St Lucia and Herston campuses, is the capital city of Queensland and its economic and cultural hub. Young and progressive, the city is fast becoming a centre in the Asia-Pacific for business, investment, major events and education. It is also home to over 200 nationalities and 220 languages.

Entertainment

Brisbane city has a great live music scene that can be discovered in Fortitude Valley and West End. For comedy, live theatre and dance, head to the Brisbane Powerhouse and the Queensland Performing Arts Centre (QPAC). The Gallery of Modern Art (GOMA) is one of the best modern

art galleries in the country, and keep an eye out for the Brisbane Writers Festival and the Brisbane Festival that attract international artists from across the globe.

Sport

Brisbane's amazing weather and sporting facilities make physical activity a must. Kayak along the Brisbane River, rock climb your way to the top of the Kangaroo Point Cliffs, ride along kilometres of riverside cycle paths or join a sporting club. If you prefer to spectate, cheer for your local team when you attend a rugby union, rugby league, cricket, 'Aussie Rules', tennis, or football match at one of our famous sporting stadiums.

Food

With just under a third of Brisbane's population born overseas, you can find cuisine from almost every culture. From affordable lunchtime and 'Cheap Tuesday' offers, to reasonably priced cafes, pubs, restaurants and farmers' markets, there is plenty to choose from and plenty of new culinary experiences to be had. And you can always enjoy a picnic with friends and use the city's free barbecue facilities in one of our scenic parks by the river.

Getting around

One of the best views of Brisbane is from a CityCat – a ferry service that runs along the river from UQ's St Lucia campus to the city and the riverside suburb of Hamilton. Brisbane also has

an extensive bus and train network that makes it easy to get around. A 'go card' will allow you to travel on all Brisbane public transport at discounted student prices.

Around Brisbane

When you want to head out of the city, there is plenty to discover. Head south for the famous golden sands of the Gold Coast and Byron Bay, north for the quiet beaches of the Sunshine Coast, the world's oldest rainforest, or the majestic Great Barrier Reef. Go west for charming outback towns or east for the spectacular Moreton Island, Stradbroke Island and Fraser Island. Sydney, Cairns and Melbourne are all short flights away. There is so much to explore on your doorstep.

GATTON

Gatton, the largest town in South-East Queensland's Lockyer Valley, is the home of the UQ Gatton campus. Bordered by unspoilt mountain ranges and located only one hour's drive from Brisbane, Gatton has a culturally diverse population of approximately 7000 people. 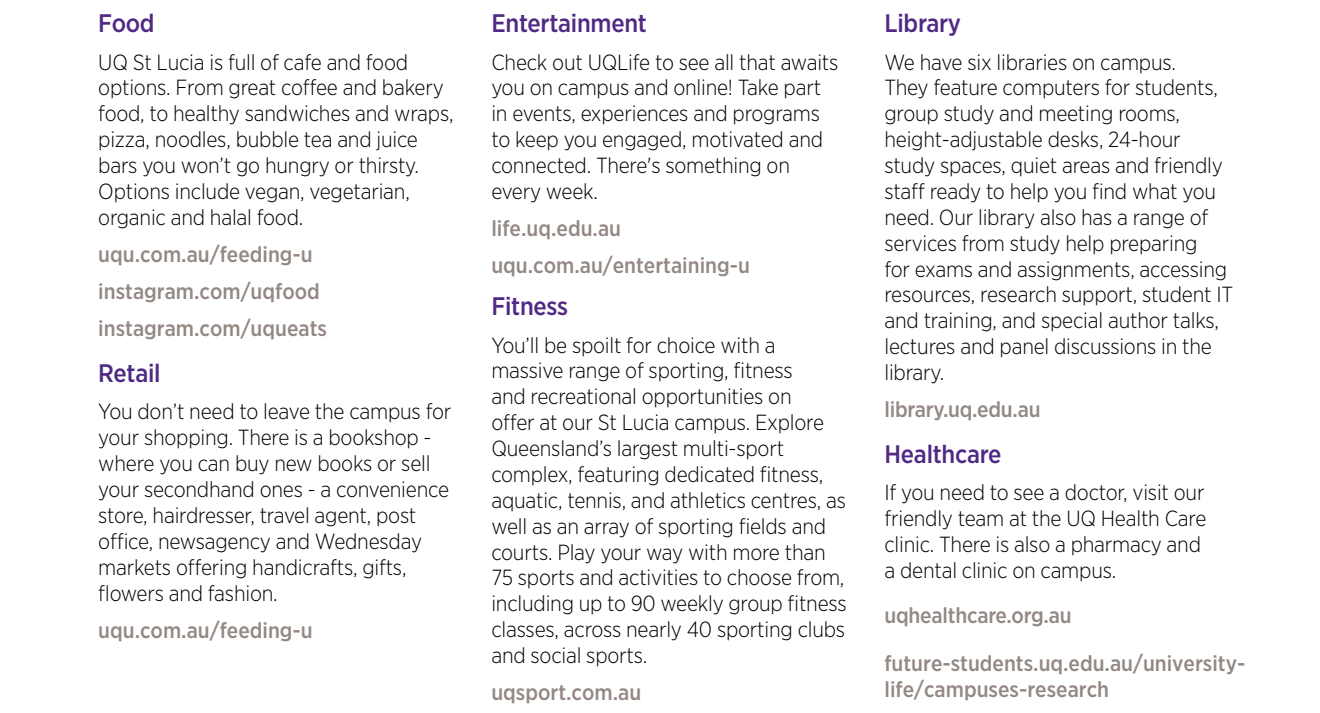
Library

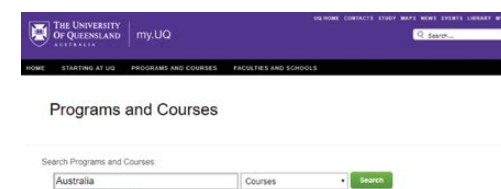

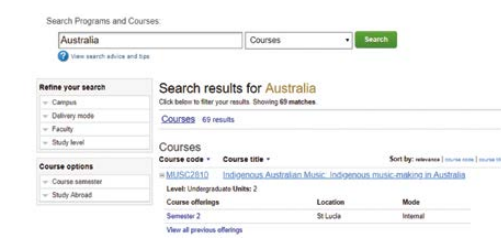

Here you will find a short description of the course as well as a link to a detailed course profile: if the course is pre-approved for Study Abroad and Incoming Exchange students, there will be a note on the sidebar on the left stating this (if the course is not pre-approved, you must meet the prerequisites to apply). 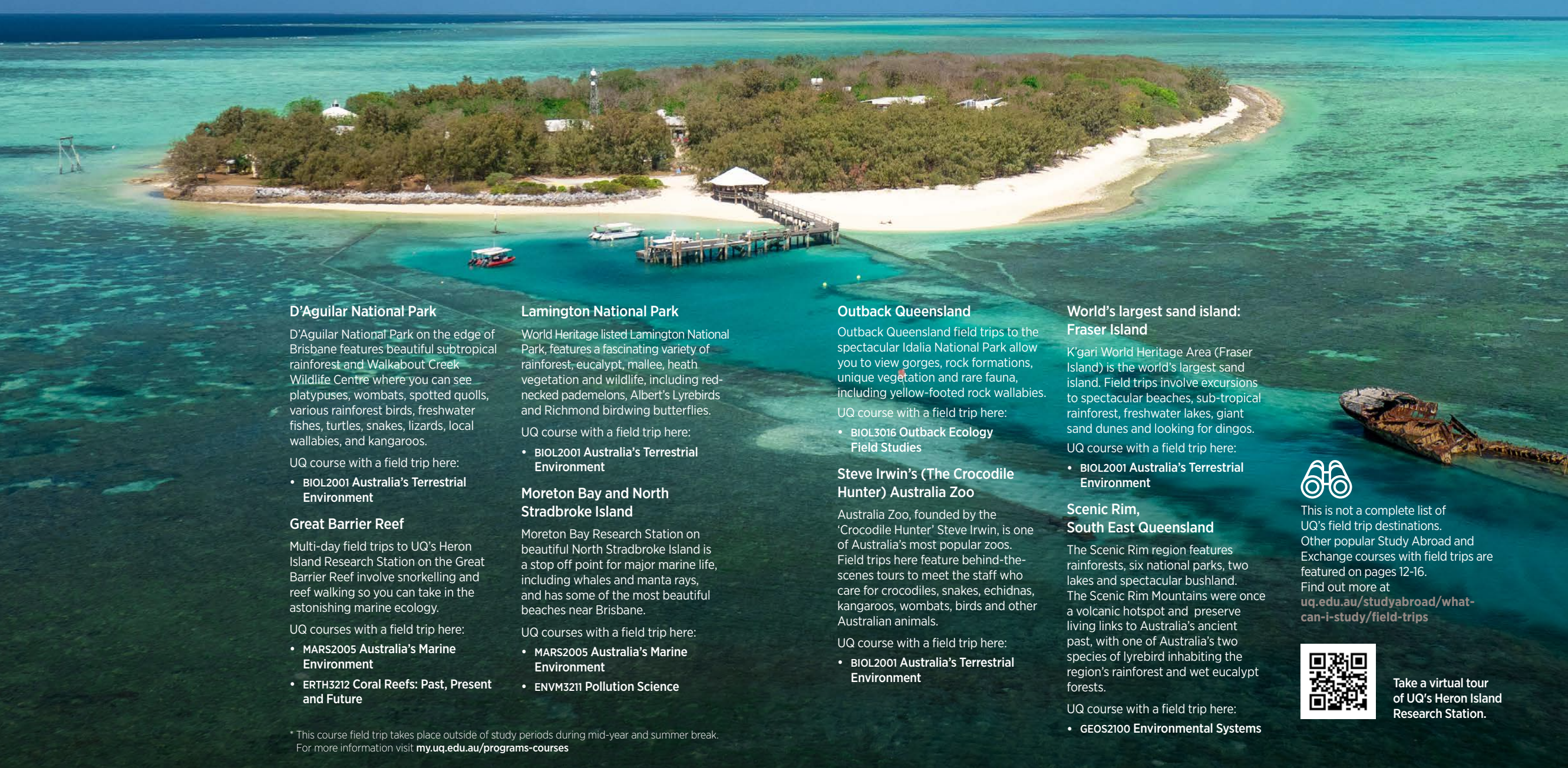


Explore Queensland: courses with field trips

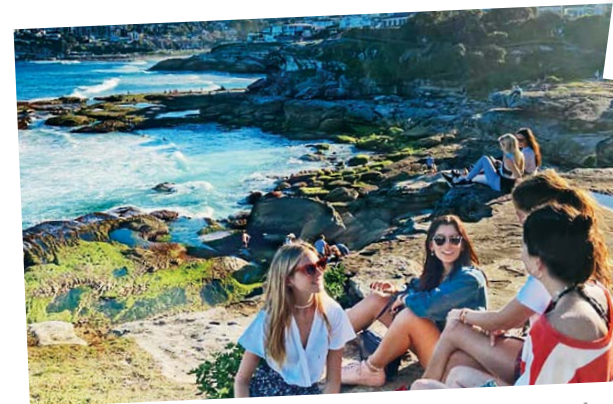

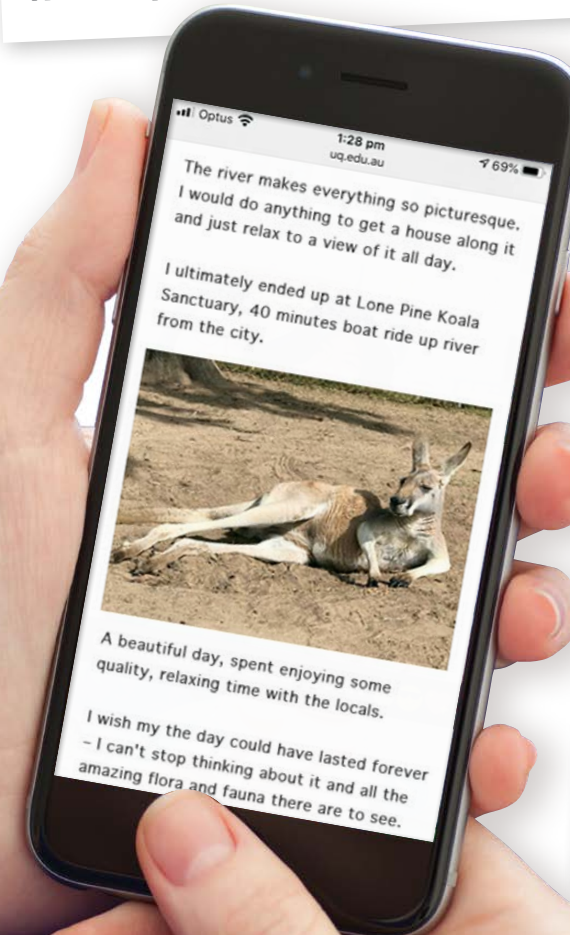

Private housing

Are you the more independent type? You might like to share a house or apartment with other people. Brisbane's rental market features everything from low-cost share

houses to high-rise apartments, while Gatton's rental market features a range of affordable share houses. To find a room, apartment or house, first check our UQ Rentals database. There are also private rental accommodation websites and you can rent directly from real estate agents. At the start of a lease you typically pay two weeks rent in advance and a bond (four weeks rent). You should get the bond back at the end of your lease if you maintain the property well. Make sure you inspect a property in person before paying money or signing anything. Arrive around one month before classes start to get organised, arrange inspections and lodge your rental application. Make sure you arrange temporary accommodation for when you land, if needed.

Cost of living

Brisbane is an affordable city, offering a lower cost of living than Sydney, Melbourne, Perth or Canberra. ^ To make the most of your time in Australia, we recommend you plan and budget for your study and holiday time.

Yearly costs

How much it will cost you to live in Brisbane will depend partly on your lifestyle preferences. For example, if you live in a share house off-campus, your yearly budget will be in the range of \$12,960 – \$33,060.

In addition to this amount, you will also need to consider establishment costs such as buying furniture, paying a rental bond and setting up electricity, gas and mobile phone accounts, as well as other expenses such as visa and medical fees, tuition fees, return airfares, and Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC). Remember that exchange rate variations may also affect your budget.

Monthly expenses

The table below estimates monthly expenses for studying at UQ. These estimates are a guide only and prices vary according to your lifestyle. UQ tuition fees, textbooks and study materials, clothing, entertainment, printing, and healthcare costs are in addition to the figures below.

Working while studying

If you have a student visa you can work up to 40 hours per fortnight (two-week period) during university semesters, and full-time hours during holidays. In general, students shouldn't expect to cover tuition fees or living expenses with a casual job.

If you are studying at UQ on a scholarship, you should contact your scholarship provider about how many hours you are permitted to work each week.

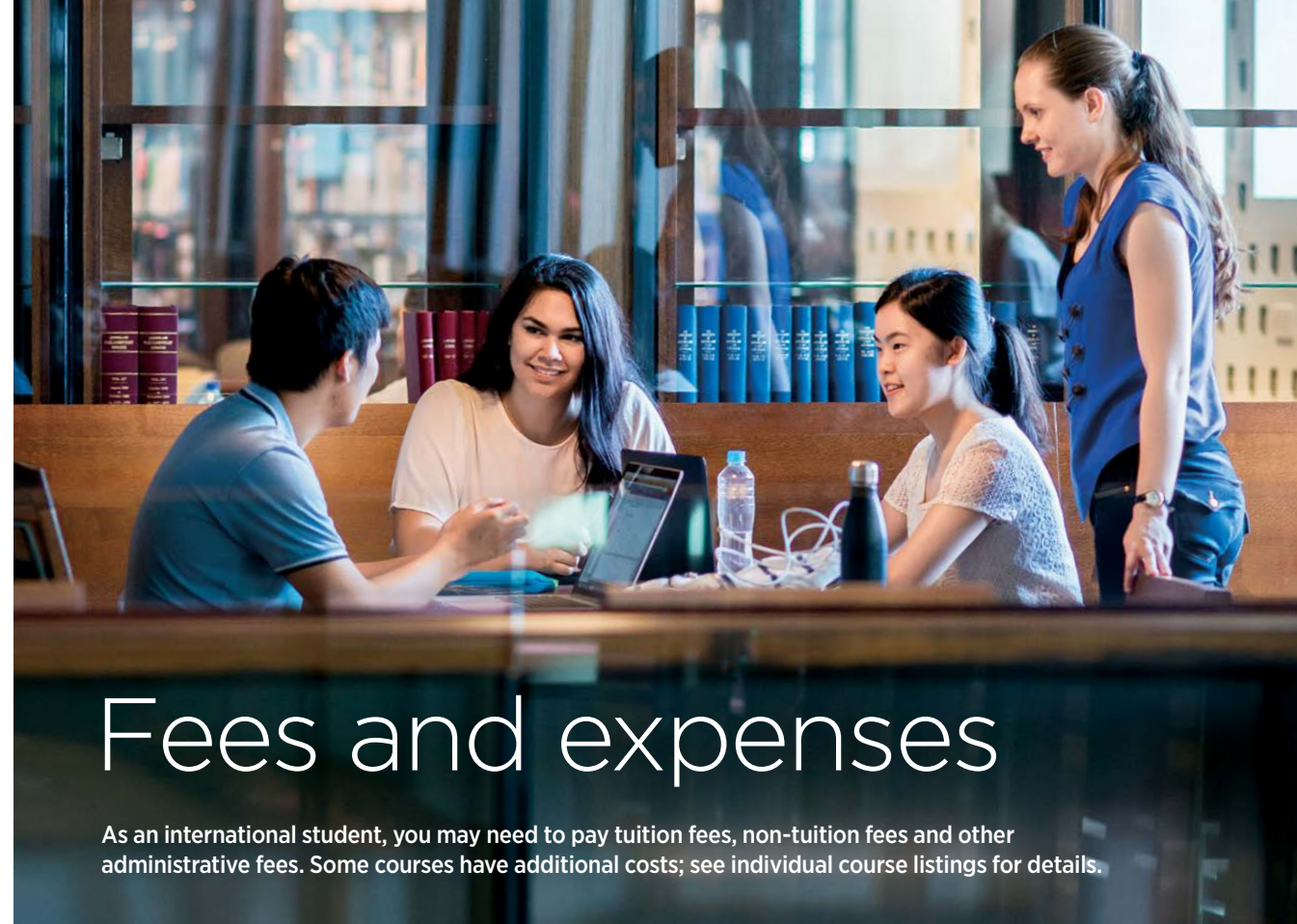

Fees and expenses

As an international student, you may need to pay tuition fees, non-tuition fees and other administrative fees. Some courses have additional costs; see individual course listings for details.

Tuition fees

Study Abroad – four courses

If you apply for the standard four-course Study Abroad program for 2022, you will pay a tuition fee of \$13,180 per semester regardless of the number of courses taken. A standard full-time load for one semester at UQ is eight units (which usually equates to four courses). Please note, this fee is indexed annually and is subject to change.

Study Abroad – three courses

If you apply for the three-course Study Abroad program for 2022, you will pay a reduced tuition fee of \$9,885 per semester but you will be restricted to taking six units (three courses) only. Please check with your home university before choosing this option to ensure that you will receive the credit that you need when you return.

Please note, this fee is indexed annually and is subject to change.

Incoming Exchange

As an Incoming exchange student, you will pay tuition fees to your

home institution based on the fee requirements of your home institution. A standard full-time study load for one semester at UQ is eight units (which usually equates to four courses). You should contact the Exchange Office at your home institution for details.

Non-tuition fees

Non-tuition fees are fees paid by a student to the University for such things as books and equipment, health insurance, administration, accommodation, and assistance to apply for or hold a student visa.

Health insurance

If you will be coming to Australia on a student visa, you will need to purchase and maintain Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) as one of the conditions of your visa. This is an insurance policy that covers you for basic medical and

hospital care and is required from the day you arrive in Australia until you leave. UQ's preferred OSHC provider is Allianz Care.

UQ can organise your OSHC with Allianz when you accept your UQ offer and pay your tuition fee deposit. Alternatively, you can obtain your own OSHC from a government-approved OSHC provider.

Are you eligible?

Study Abroad eligibility

The UQ Study Abroad program is available to students currently studying at an accredited institution outside of Australia. As a Study Abroad student, you can study at UQ for one or two semesters and will be enrolled as a non-award student.

Academic entry requirements

To meet the University's entry requirements for the Study Abroad program you must:

- have completed at least one full-time year of study at an accredited university
- be currently enrolled at an accredited university
- meet specific course prerequisites for admission into certain courses
- hold average to above-average results in university studies to date
- meet UQ's English language proficiency requirements (see below).

Incoming Exchange eligibility

The UQ Incoming Exchange program is available to students currently studying at an overseas institution that has a student exchange agreement with UQ. As an Incoming Exchange student

you can study at UQ for one or two semesters and will be enrolled as a non-award student. You should contact the International Exchange Office at your home institution for more information about studying at UQ on exchange. To check if your university is a UQ exchange partner, see: uq.edu.au/studyabroad/am-i-eligible

Academic entry requirements

To meet the University's entry requirements for Incoming Exchange you must:

- be currently enrolled at an exchange partner university
- be nominated by your home university
- have completed at least one full-time year of study at an accredited university
- meet specific course prerequisites for admission into certain courses
- hold average to above-average results in university studies to date.

Credit transfer

Credit gained at UQ is in most cases transferable to your degree at your home university.

It is important that your home institution approves your intended course of study to ensure smooth

credit transfer. Make sure you check with your home university if you must enrol in a full-time load (four courses) or are able to do the three-course option. A standard full-time load at UQ is eight units, which usually equates to four courses per semester.

Choosing courses

You may take courses across multiple faculties as long as your course choices are approved by your home university. Most courses are open to Study Abroad and Incoming Exchange students. However, some have prerequisites or require permission from the relevant faculty or school before you can enrol in them: see pages 12–16.

Visas

All international students applying to study in Australia must have a student visa unless they have an alternative visa that enables them to study. If you are granted a student visa, you must comply with all student visa conditions. For all visa enquiries and applications, please contact your local Australian Embassy, High Commission or Diplomatic Mission.

Suspensions, deferrals and cancellations

If you wish to defer (i.e. delay commencing the Study Abroad or Incoming Exchange program), please contact the Study Abroad and Incoming Exchange Office as soon as possible. You may be able to apply for a deferral for up to two years.

Once you commence study, you may also suspend or cancel your enrolment on compassionate or other compelling grounds. The University may also suspend or cancel your enrolment for a number of reasons including misbehaviour, poor academic standing and unsatisfactory academic progress. Please note that any suspensions, deferrals or cancellations may affect your student visa or visa application.
