On the Recovery of Chalcedonian Christology

Dietrich Bonhoeffer's Theology as Focal Point for Contemporary Christology

August 23–27, 2021

Venue: Faculty of Protestant Theology, Eberhard Karls Universität Tübingen, Germany

The work of Dietrich Bonhoeffer revolves around Christology. Unusual for his own time, Bonhoeffer, clearly emphasized the importance of Christology for the dogmatic reflection on faith and the necessity of its adequate articulation not only in ecumenism but also in a “world come of age”. This workshop explores Bonhoeffer’s Christology in its various contexts.

The workshop will discuss papers by early career researchers on Bonhoeffer's Christology and will include readings of classical texts of Christology (Gregory of Nazianz, Basil of Caesarea, Theodor of Mopsuestia, ...)
