



E312: Bachelor's Thesis Seminar on Empirical Public Economics

Content & Objectives:

The seminar will deal with selected topics in public economics. Students are expected to write a 20-page essay (bachelor thesis) and to present their work in class (both in English). Essays and presentations are based on journal articles. Having some basic knowledge in empirical economics and microeconomic theory is very helpful, as the articles usually apply micro-econometric techniques as well as micro theory models.

Note that you should attach a recent transcript to this email. If you have a preference about a specific topic which you want to discuss in your thesis (or if you want to conduct your own empirical analysis, etc.), please let me know (I will otherwise assign topics/papers to students).

Our first meeting will take place on **April 19, 2022**. More details will be announced by email. Note that we will have weekly meetings! Topics and papers will be assigned after the first meeting.
