

## More flexibility in choosing courses for students in M.Sc. Management and Economics

The curriculum for the M.Sc. in Management and Economics has been revised to establish a higher degree of flexibility to all current and future students. To achieve this goal, we have added new course options within many sections of the curriculum. The most important revision concerns the Core Studies, where students will now be able to choose three core modules out of a selection of currently five available options. Furthermore, students will now be able to choose from several possible courses to fulfil the compulsory 6 ECTS credits in Selected Issues in Managerial Economics (former: (only) B519, now: all courses under *MSC-MECO-SI-23*). In addition, all course options from the Core Studies and Selected Issues in Managerial Economics will also be available as Specialization Studies modules. All new course options can be found in the tables below in **bold**.

The overall structure of the program (e.g. how many credits are required in the Core, Specialization and Free Elective Studies etc.) remains unchanged. Additionally, there are no changes to the Advanced Topics module, the Master Thesis in Management and Economics and the Free Elective Studies.

These changes apply to all students, regardless of the examination regulation version they are enrolled in. There is *no action* required by individual students to make use of these changes.
