

UCT's main campus is located on the lower slopes of the Table Mountain range above a peaceful, leafy suburb of Cape Town – and just a 10 minute drive from the City Bowl. A bus shuttle service, called the Jammie Shuttle, is available free to all UCT students and staff. · Application deadline: 31 October

2ND SEMESTER: July - November

· Application deadline: 30 April

How to apply

Students should complete an online UCT International Student application form before the application closing date, and submit all relevant documentation. This is available at: http://applyonline.uct.ac.za/

- Applicants from the USA are expected to have an overall grade point average of 3.0 or above. Additional requirements may also apply.
- Applicants from other countries are assessed on the basis of their academic transcript.
- Proof of English language proficiency is required where it is not an applicant's first language or home university's medium of instruction.
- Students applying for the Feb to June semester must apply by 31 October
- · Studentsapplying for the July to November semester must apply by 30 April.

Study Visas and Permits

UCT will issue the letter you need to apply for a study visa from your local South African embassy or consulate. You cannot study in South Africa without this permit. It takes about eight weeks to obtain.

Please note that a police clearance certificate may also be required: you should apply for this as early as possible (no letter is needed to make this application).

Tuition
