Duration of Studies

The standard length of study is four semesters. Teachers and other school professionals may receive credit for their practical experience, potentially shortening the program to one academic year plus a final semester. Students with a Master of Education (M. Ed.) degree may also receive credit for prior coursework in educational sciences. Part-time study options are available for working professionals or those with family responsibilities, extending the standard study period. Credit for practical experience or prior M. Ed. coursework may also apply here, allowing for a shorter duration of study.
