Transport is cheap and easy

Wollongong is close to Sydney – just 90 minutes by road or train. Once you arrive here, your transport options around the city are safe, easy and affordable.

Compare the cost of living

Being a student city, the cost of living is lower than many Australian cities, including Sydney and Melbourne. In Wollongong you can focus on your study, not your finances.



Free Buses

Wollongong is well-connected with buses going to all of the surrounding suburbs.

Free 'city loop' buses run all day and into the night, making it easy for you to travel from campus and student accommodation to the city centre, train station and shopping district.

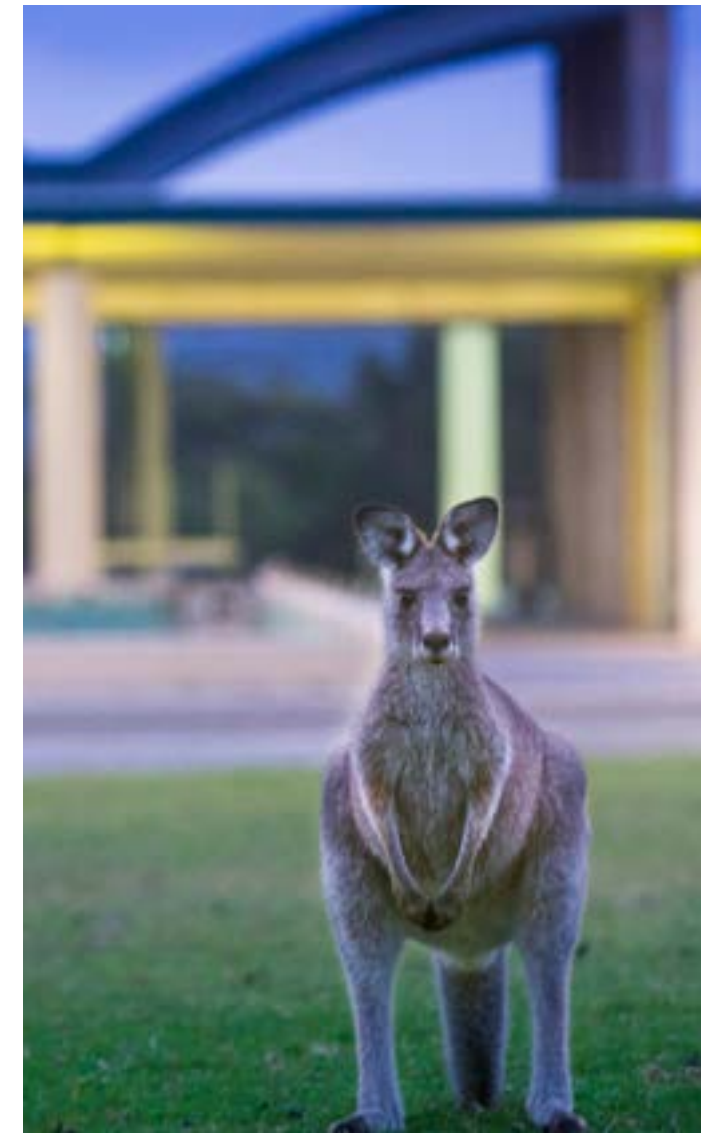
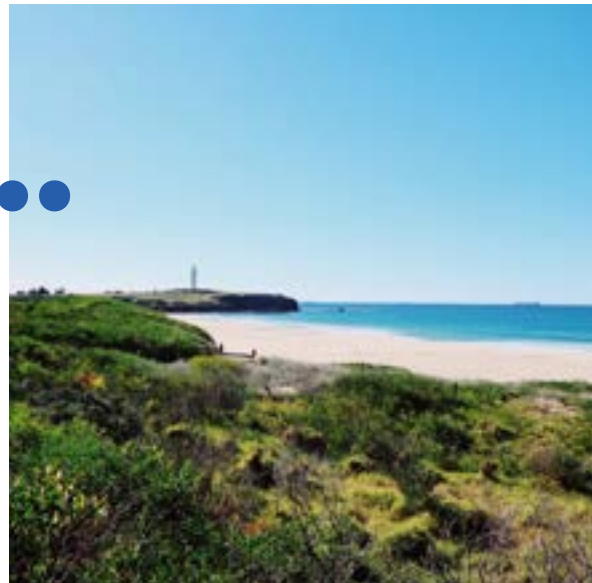
Enjoy food and drinks with a view at one of many cafés and restaurants overlooking the Pacific Ocean in North Wollongong.

Counselling services

This free and confidential counselling service is available five days a week to assist you with personal, study or work-related difficulties. Counselling can involve identifying and choosing between options, and learning new skills to cope better with problems. It can also help you to gain greater understanding of your situation when recovering from a significant life event.

Religious services

There are a range of religious services on and off-campus, including a Muslim prayer space, the Omar Mosque close by the University, the Nan Tien Buddhist Temple in nearby Berkeley and the Sri Venkateswara Hindu Temple. Student-based religious clubs include the Buddhist Society, Chinese Christian Fellowship, Uni Bible Group and the Muslim Association of Wollongong University.

Student Support Advisers

These advisers provide support and referral services to UOW students. They also facilitate programs that support student equity and diversity both within faculties and across campus. They can assist with a range of issues such as orientation to the local area, study difficulties, academic concerns, budgeting and homesickness. The free and confidential service can also help with legal issues, children's education, student visas, family emergencies, and health and personal problems.

UOW Security service

UOW Security helps provide a safe and secure campus environment with trained and licensed security officers providing emergency response, first aid, after dark escorts and patrols. The service operates 24-hours a day, seven days a week.

Student Queer Collective for LGBTQI+

The Allsorts Queer Collective is a social and support group run by queer people for queer people. Allsorts strives to provide a safe and comfortable space for LGBTQI+ students (and staff) at UOW by hosting events, providing support and resources, and overall increasing the queer presence on campus.

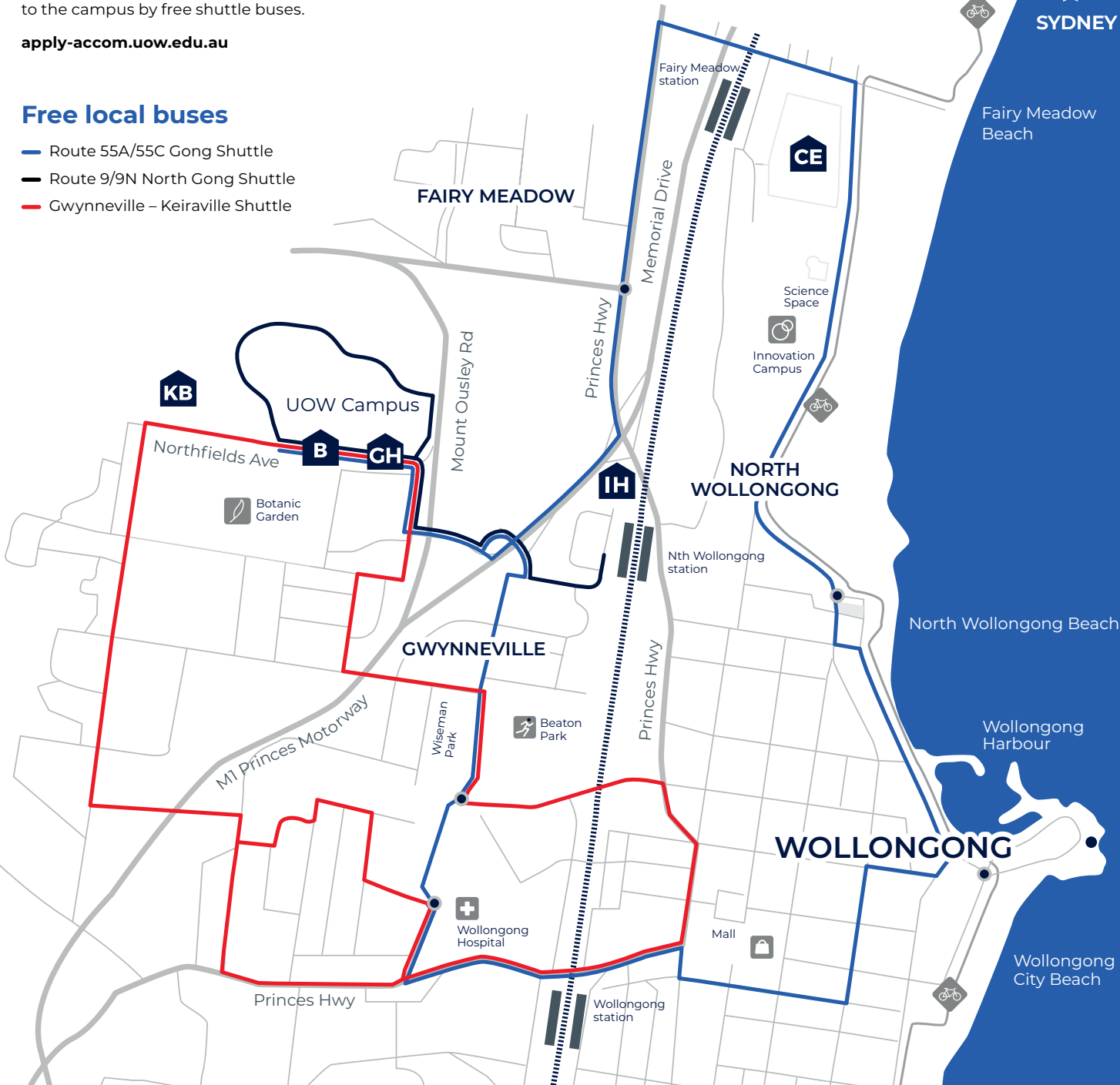
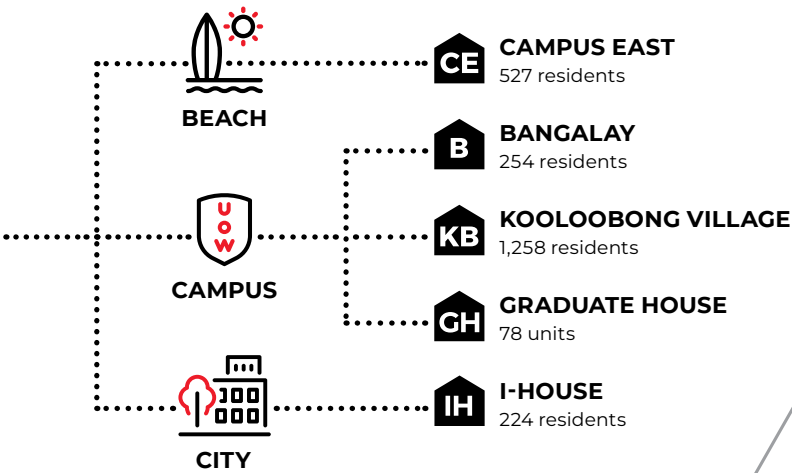

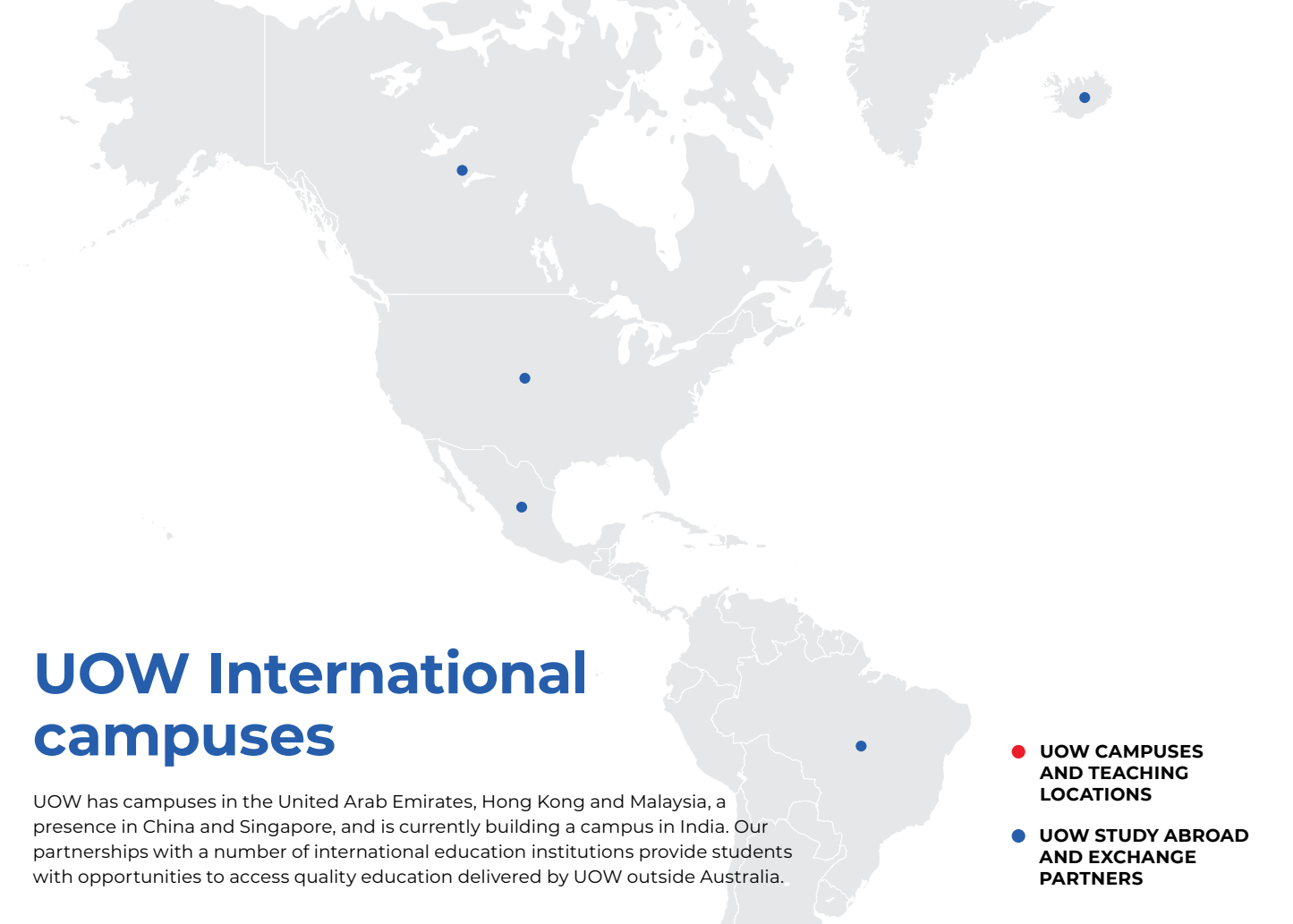


A truly global university

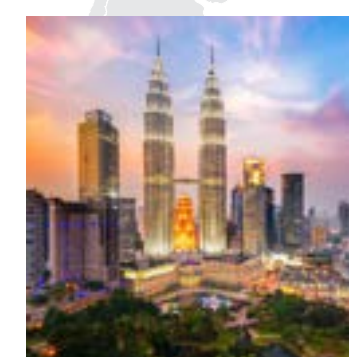

Study options

Choosing your program

Study Abroad and Exchange programs are designed for international undergraduate or postgraduate students who wish to spend one or two semesters in a program of study at the University of Wollongong and transfer the credits to their home institution. For application procedure information see, page 27.

Study Abroad program

The Study Abroad program is designed to welcome students to UOW from both formally recognised study abroad partners and non-affiliated institutions for one or two semesters.

Study Abroad students pay tuition fees directly to UOW for their program of study at UOW.

International Exchange program

The University of Wollongong has established formal exchange agreements with a number of leading universities worldwide. This program allows a limited number of students to study at UOW for one or two semesters. Exchange students are not required to pay tuition fees to UOW. Refer to the list of exchange partners on pages 30-31, and contact your home university for more information.

Business Internship program

The Business Internship program is designed to offer students undertaking any business or Bachelor of Business degree with the opportunity to add a Work Integrated Learning Experience to their study. The COMM391 subject supports the program with the required theory and concepts to enhance what is learned during the internship. To be admitted into this program, students are required to go through a competitive recruitment process, including a written application, video and Skype interviews with potential employers. Students interested in applying for the program will need to advise the Office of Global Student Mobility in advance. Only if the timing of submission is in accordance with the specific program recruitment times will applications be considered. Successful students are required to enrol in at least one other subject from the Faculty of Business and Law along with COMM391, and one or two other UOW subjects to make up a full-time study load. Visiting Research program

The Visiting Research program is designed for students undertaking research at either an undergraduate or postgraduate level who are currently enrolled full-time at an overseas university and wish to obtain research experience with a UOW research team. This program is usually between three and six months in duration and must be a formal requirement for the degree at the student's home university. Securing a UOW academic supervisor is the responsibility of the applicant. Participants must contact the relevant UOW faculty or school to gain the support of a member of UOW academic staff to supervise their project.



Choosing your subjects

Subjects are taught as a mix of lectures, tutorials or seminars, laboratory work where appropriate, and individual study. Study Abroad and Exchange students are assessed in the same way as Australian students.

Planning a program of study

Study Abroad and Exchange students enrol for one or two sessions as a non-award student at UOW. The year is broken into semesters, with UOW taking enrolments in Autumn (February) or Spring (July).

If you are studying a postgraduate business program through Sydney Business School, UOW, either in Sydney or Wollongong, your sessions are trimesters and start in February, May and August.

As part of your application to study at UOW, you will be required to submit a Study Plan. This is a list of proposed UOW subjects that will be assessed based on your academic background prior to your arrival. Every effort will be made to obtain approval of your selected subjects, however this is not guaranteed.

You'll need to be flexible with your subject selection, and be prepared with additional subject choices. Academic advice on your study program is available from UOW staff during orientation week. We advise that you bring a current transcript of your academic record from your home university or college, as well as subject outlines and descriptions.

It is your responsibility to ensure that the proposed program will earn the credits needed to satisfy the degree requirements of your home university or college.

Choosing subjects

Subject availability

When choosing subjects, note that many subjects at the Wollongong campus are ONLY offered in either Autumn (February) or Spring (July).

Postgraduate business subjects are offered by UOW's Sydney Business School at the Wollongong and Sydney CBD campuses on a trimester system. Trimesters begin in February, May, and August. Students enrol in three subjects (18 credit points) per trimester.

Students must decide whether they wish to study at the Wollongong or Sydney CBD campus, and only select subjects available at that campus. Students cannot select subjects in a Wollongong or Sydney-based program that includes both trimesters and semesters.

Study areas

UOW offers courses and subjects across a wide range of study areas. Study Abroad and Exchange students are welcome to choose any combination of courses (at UOW we call them 'subjects') offered by the University, and studies can be undertaken across multiple academic disciplines or schools*. The following pages list the subject areas available to our Study Abroad and Exchange students with the degree levels indicated against each.

*Please note that postgraduate subjects are not available to undergraduate/bachelor level students. Remember to check for subject prerequisites.

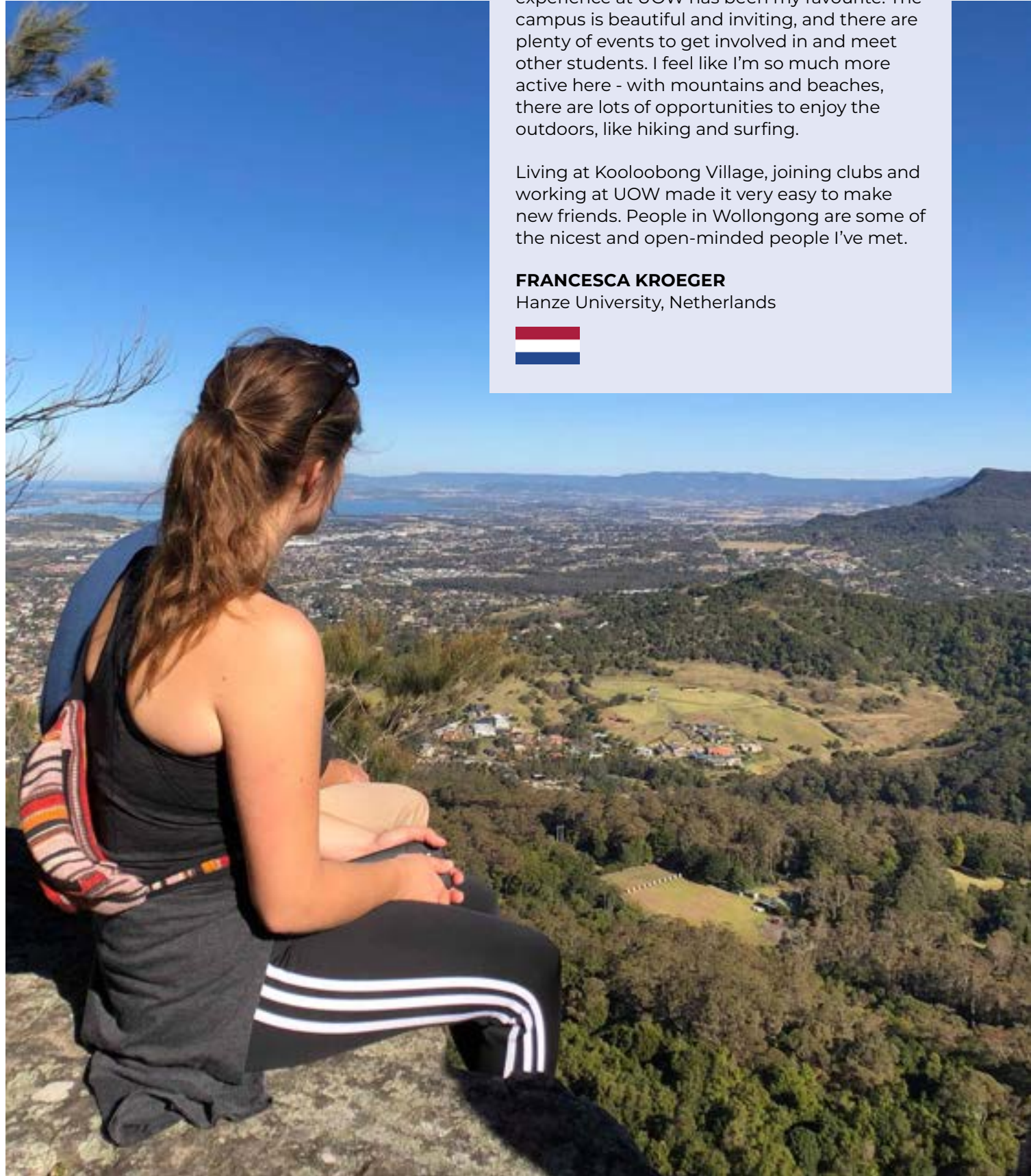

Study Abroad & International Exchange program

Academic requirements

- Completion of at least one year of study at a university or other recognised tertiary institution.
- A cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.7 or higher on a 4.0 scale.

English language requirements

IELTS

- 6.0 academic overall, and 6.0 in reading and writing.

TOEFL

- 550 paper
- 213 computer
- 4.0 TWE/Essay Rating
- 79 internet-based with no less than 20 in writing, 18 in reading, 17 in listening and 16 in speaking.

Applicants who have studied in a country where English is the medium of instruction may be exempted — this includes studies in English-speaking countries, as well as completion of schooling in Malaysia, Hong Kong and Singapore, and examination results in high school English subjects in some European and Scandinavian countries.

English Language programs

English for Academic Purposes (EAP)

English for Academic Purposes (EAP) is for students who want to develop the foundations of English for studying in tertiary programs. It provides an opportunity to learn English language in context in preparation for university study. After successful completion of a core unit of study, students may have the option to:

- Enter the advanced level ETS program to reach university entry level
- Enter our Foundation Studies course
- Enter a UOW College Australia Diploma course.

Our EAP course helps students to prepare for more formal academic studies in English. Students develop academic language skills and have the opportunity to practise these, as well as developing skills in both critical thinking and independent study skills. If you are wanting to move into our Foundation Studies, Diploma or ETS programs, but don't yet meet the entry requirements for English Language, this course is for you!

English Plus Uni

Offered through UOW College, English Plus Uni is for students who do not have English as their first language, and have not met the required level of English to undertake a formal semester program.

Students audit one or two university subjects and, at the same time, take part-time English language classes. Students study English for fourteen hours per week and attend their chosen university subject(s) for three to six hours per week.

Students receive a transcript from UOW College for their studies. Home universities may choose to offer credit for this program.

Study tours and group programs

UOW offers customised study tour programs for groups of students. Study tours can be held at any time of the year, and consist of English language training and/or academic components and/or leisure and social research activities.

For all or some of the study tour components, the home university may choose to grant credit towards studies at the home university.
