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**Center for
Languages and Culture**

As the International Cooperation Office is well aware, the language barrier poses an issue to all forms of international relations.

Bearing that in mind, and with the intention of opening our institution even further to the world, the Center for Languages and Culture offers four formats of Portuguese for Foreigners courses, concerning the topics of language and culture, for students from partner institutions.

All online activities are conducted through Google Classroom.

Crash course

Online: two weeks of synchronous classes and asynchronous activities, for undergraduate students who wish to learn the language before coming to UFF.

On-site: follows the same model of the online course and is geared towards foreign undergraduate students who declare a basic knowledge of Portuguese. The course is offered at times defined upon the arrival of foreign students at UFF.

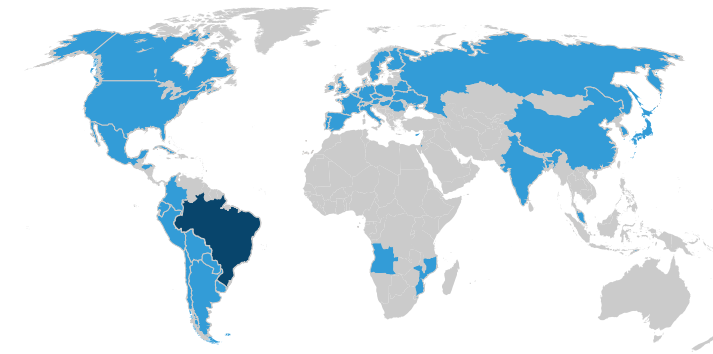
Regular course

Online: synchronous classes offered twice a week throughout UFF's academic semester, complemented by asynchronous activities performed by the students.

On-site: classes offered throughout UFF's academic semester for international mobility students. This course offers a placement test at the beginning of the classes, to better distribute students among Basic, Intermediate and Advanced level classes.

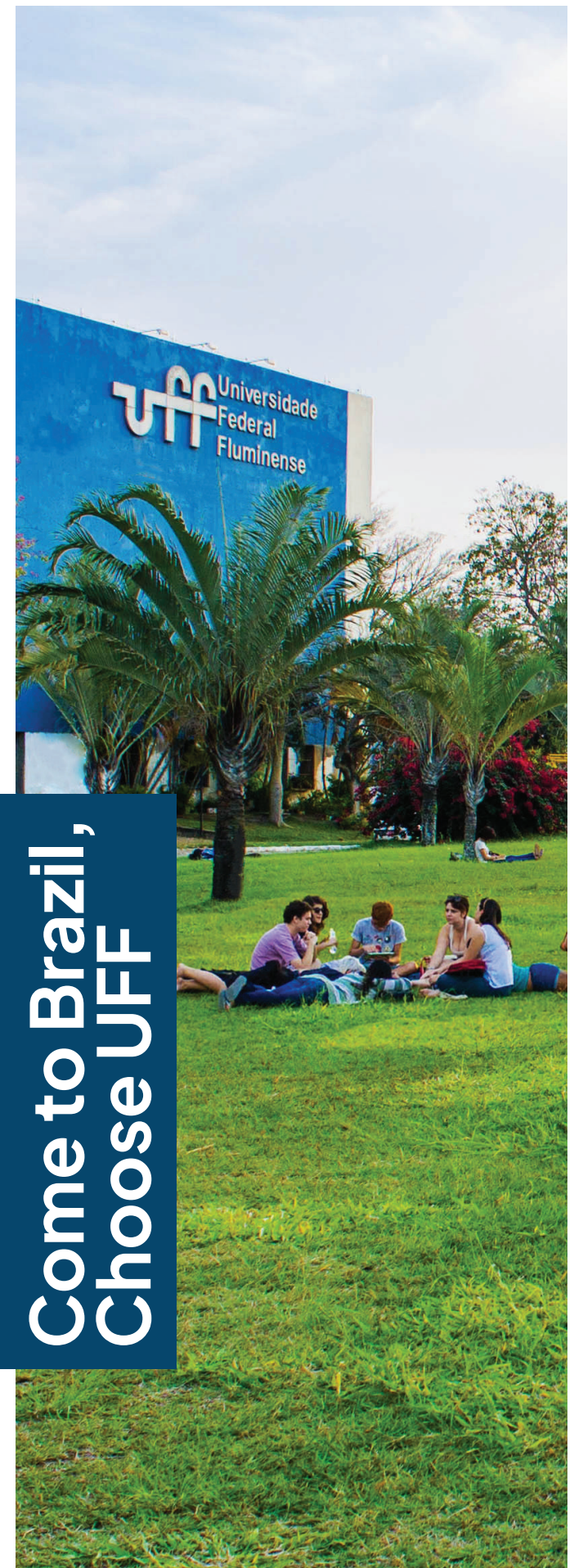

The challenges of our time: how to understand them and seek solutions?

The **Minor in Global Challenges** brings together students and professors from around the world to debate the UN Sustainable Development Goals, with an emphasis on Inequalities.

What is the course?

The Minor in Global Challenges is an interdisciplinary program that complements the student's major, and it is offered entirely in a foreign language (English, Spanish, and French). Its courses revolve around a common topic, namely, Global Inequalities. The student who completes the program receives a certificate of his studies.

How is the course structured?

By integrating international topics into the local curriculum, the Minor in Global Challenges amplifies the scope of opportunities for foreign students at UFF and promotes partnerships and stronger interactions between the international academic community and local students and researchers. In all its dimensions, the course puts to practice the concept of internationalization at home.

Alongside the student's academic path, this course complements the training of a professional that develops greater understanding and awareness of the most diverse forms of inequality observed worldwide in the social, economic, and environmental spheres.

Who can take the course?

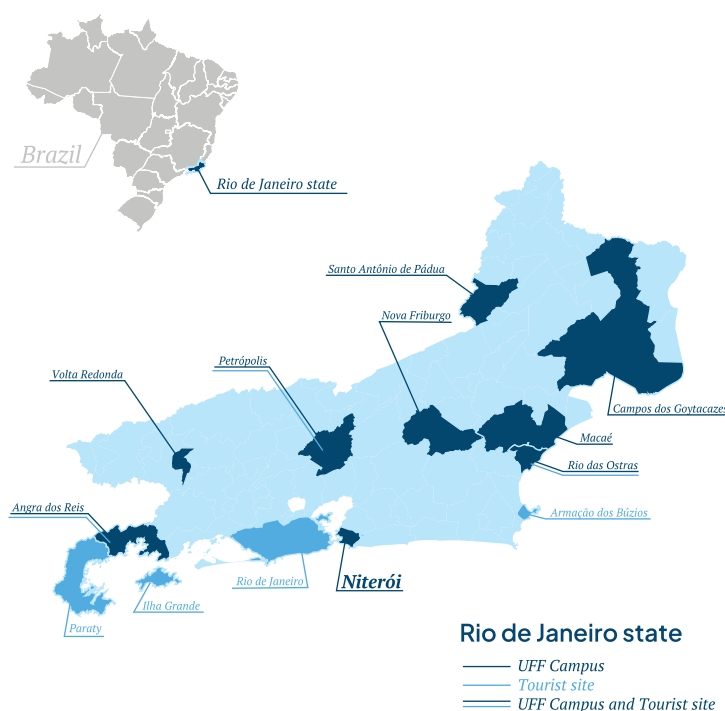
Undergraduate and graduate students at UFF as well as students from foreign partner institutions.

Founded in 1960, **Universidade Federal Fluminense (UFF)** is a public institution, part of the Brazilian federal higher education system. Its headquarters are located in the city of Niterói and its campuses can be found in various parts of the state of Rio de Janeiro, as a result of a strong decentralization policy. There is also an out-of-state campus in Oriximiná, in the Amazon rainforest.

UFF stated mission is to produce, disseminate, and apply knowledge and culture in a critical and socially relevant way.



International Undergraduate students

Students from all over the world are welcome to join our Mobility Program. The International Cooperation Office will help you prepare for your mobility, providing information on the necessary administrative procedures to come to this country as well as enrollment at the university. One week before the beginning of each semester, we organize a Welcome Day to provide further detailed orientation as well as give students and researchers the opportunity to meet one another as part of our *Buddy Program*.

The university also launched the *International Labs Program* to encourage its laboratories to take in more international students and researchers, who may come at any time of the year, for as many months as they wish and have full access to the university facilities.

Students may come to UFF to take courses, participate in research groups or work in laboratories.

The *International Labs Program* aims to encourage laboratories, in which English is usually used as a lingua franca, to take in as many international students and researchers as they possibly can.
